Land was Palmer-Haves surveyed for Charles SEALE in Craven County, S.C. on Sawney's Branch of the Wateree River in sah350 on 29 Apr 2010 by the fall of 1769, and this land was granted to him in the spring of 1770. Thus, presumably James moved with his father to S.C. as an infant. James grew up in old Craven County, S.C., HOGANS OF LITTLE EGYPT a part of Camden District. This are became Fairfield County in 1785, then in 1800 became Fairfield District. James lived with his sister Lydia and her husband, Abraham, after their marriage for jeanne790 on 6 Nov 2009 several years. Lydia and Abraham Peavy were married in Wilkes Co., Georgia on 6 SEP 1784 [brother James says wedding was in 1786]. James returned to S.C. by 1791. Based on the ages of Totten/Bell FamilyTree his eldest children, James first married about 1792 or 1793 to Rachel (possibly Kelley). by AliceTotten on 1 Nov 2009 Deeds dated 1802 and 1809 give his wife's name as **Rachel**. The 1800, 1810 and 1820 Censuses indicate **Rachel** was born between 1770 and 1774. 1880 and 1900 Censuses of the children indicate that **Rachel** was born in S.C. It is difficult to estimate when **Rachel** died, sometime before Cox Family Tree 1830. James and Rachel farmed and raised their children in Fairfield County/District, S.C. As late frostie97 on 25 Aug 2009 by as 1794, all of the children of Charles and Lydia SEALE (except for Nancy) were living in Fairfield County, S.C. But by 1818, James was the only SEALE left. James moved to Butler Co., ALA in Bath, Generating, Constanting, Carlos and Constanting and C Robinson akamerlina on 17 Aug 2009 by with 2 males under 10 years [William-age 3, Anderson-age 8]; with 1 male 10-15 years [Ransomage 11]; with 1 male 26-44 years [James-age 41]; with 3 females under 10 years [Matilda-age 5, ??]; with 3 females 10-15 years [?, Mary-age 14, Elizabeth-age 16]; with 1 female 26-44 years [Rachel-age 25]. James bought land in Wilkinson Co., GEO in 1811, but if he ever moved there it Christy Davis was for only a short time. He was residing in Fairfield in JAN 1811, and then every year between christyd003 on 6 May 2009 by OCT 1812 and 1820, he is found as a resident of Fairfield. If he actually moved to Georgia again, it must have been only for the growing seasons of 1811 and possibly 1812. General Andrew Jackson's military victory against the Creek nation in 1814 opened up a vast area of present day central Alabama to white settlement. On 4 AUG 1817, the first portion of this land was put on the Caudle Family Tree bigy0ker on 20 Apr 2009 by auction block in the Georgia state capitol of Milledgeville. All land office records were later transferred to the Cahaba Land Office which opened 10 OCT 1818 in Dallas County, ALA. Found in 1820 Fairfield Co., S. Carolina Census as James SEAL with 2 males under 10 years; with 1 **Baccus Family Tree** male 10-16 years; with 1 male 16-18 years; with 2 males 16-26 years; with 1 male over 45 years; with 3 females under 10 years; with 1 female 10-16 years; with 1 female 16-26 years; with 1 female granasue on 12 Apr 2009 by over 45 years; with 6 engaged in agriculture; with 1 male slave under 14 years; with 1 male slave 15-26 years; with 4 female slaves under 14 years; with 2 female slaves 26-45 years. In the fall/ winter of 1820 **James** left Fairfield District, S.C. and moved to Butler Co., Alabama, where his sister powell-monju by karenmonju on 3 Apr 2009 Lydia SEALE Peavy had settled in about 1818 or 1819. He bought a farm from the government (240 acres, possibly 400) in SEP 1821, located a few miles from Greenville, ALA, and lived there (240 acres, possibly 400) in SEP 1821, tocated a rew miles from Greenville, ALA, and lived there until about 1831. He paid \$99.70% for the 80 acres – \$.70% in change and \$99 from the Bank of S.C. Found in <u>Alabama Land Records</u> as **James SEALE**; Land Office: Cahaba; Document: 4978; Total Acres; 80; Issue Date: 16 NOV 1830. Found in <u>1830 Butler Co., Alabama Census</u> page 283, line 9 as **James SEALE** with 1 male 10-15 years [Thomas-age 14]; with 1 male 15-20 years [James-age 16]; with 1 male 60-70 years [James-age 61]; with 1 female 5-10 years [Elvina-age 10]; **CA-Parrish Family Tree** by M BeverlyH535 on 19 Feb 2009 janalbarger by with 1 female 40-50 years [Rebecca-age 45]; with 1 male slave 10-24 years; with 1 male slave 24-36 years; with 3 female slaves under 10 years; with 3 female slaves 10-25 years; with 1 female slave 24-36 years; with 1 female slave 36-55 years. Found in <u>Alabama Land Records</u> as **James SEALE;** Land Office: Cahaba; Document Number: 8365; Total Acres: 82.125; Issue Date: 1 DEC James Obie Carson clhcarson on 12 Jan 2009 1831. **James** moved to southern Lowndes County, just a short distance north of his old Butler Co. farm in about 1832 and lived there until about 1835. His daughters Elizabeth SEALE Kelley, Mary by SEALE Bates, Matilda SEALE Parmer, Clarenda SEALE Ham and Cynthia SEALE Ward had all vicky's family tree settled in the portion of Butler County that became southern Lowndes County in 1830. Sons Thomas J. and James H. bought adjoining tracts of land from the government. About 1835, 6 of vicky_white64 on 2 Jan 2009 by James' children left Lowndes Co., ALA and moved to northern Ouachita Parish, LOU. About 1836 James moved from Lowndes County where he and his children had adjoining plantations, into Autauga [now Elmore, quite close to the state capitol of Montgomery] County, ALA. James paid the government \$550 for 440 acres of land between 1829 and 1835 and he purchased 160 acres in 1837 from son, James H. SEALE. In 1839, James sold this property to Robert Burt for \$4800. On Sovereign-Poyner Family Tree Scott Sovereign on 24 Sep 2008 by 1 OCT 1839, James and wife #2, Rebecca (who released her dower rights to the land), sold the Lowndes Co. plantation of 700 acres for \$4800 (Lowndes Co., ALA Deed Book 4, page 30-31). SueBrown93 bv (Not sure why James moved to Autauga Co. as he had no children in that area.) James was only Rebecca apparently died between 1 OCT 1839 and mid-1840. Found in <u>1840 Autauga Co.</u> Rogers/Byrnes Family Tree Alabama Census page 18, line 2 as James SEALES with 1 male 40-50 years; with 1 male 60-70 LRB321 on 12 Mar 2008 by years; with 2 male slave under 10 years; with 1 male slave 36-55 years; with 2 female slave under

10 years; with 3 female slaves 10-24 years; with one female slave 24-35 years; total 11, five in agriculture. James lived in Autauga for the 16-18 years, remaining an active farmer well into his 80's. James was never wealthy, but lived better than others of the period. For most of his adult life he owned a fairly large plantation and a small number of slaves. Found in Alabama Marriages. ne owned a fainly large plantation and a small humber of slaves. Fourio in <u>Alabama Warnages</u>. <u>1809-1920 (Selected Counties) Record</u> as Hannah Ivey to James SEALS; Marriage Date: 26 JAN 1842; Marriage Place: Lowndes. On 26 JAN 1842 in Lowndes County, ALA, James married a widow, Hannah Ivey who was born about 1784 in N.C. James and Hannah had a prenuptial agreement by which all of his property would go to his children and all of her property to her heirs. Found in <u>1850 Pine Flat, Autauga Co., Alabama Census</u> enumerated 6 NOV 1850, page 48, line 8, Household #710 as James SEALS, 81, M, W, Farmer, real estate value \$1200, N.C.; with Hannah, 66, F, W, N.C.; with James, 22, M, W, Farmer, ALA. In 1851-1853 James and Hannah leave Autauga Co. and retrie back to Rulter Co. apparently living with James Pancer Bancer Anderson Autauga Co. and retire back to Butler Co., apparently living with James' sons Ransom, Anderson or William SEALE for the rest of their lives. On 14 FEB 1859 Hannah died in Butler Co., ALA at the age of about 75 years and named her daughter-in-law, Elizabeth L. Roberts as her only legatee. According to a descendant, he was nine days short of being 91 years old. Found in U.S. Federal Census Mortality Schedules Index Record as JAMES SEALE; Year: 1860; County: Butler Co.; State: ALA; Gender: M; Month of Death: FEB; State of Birth: S.C.; ID #MRT40_4675; Occupation: Gentleman; Cause of Death: Unknown.
