"Cheer up and carry on."

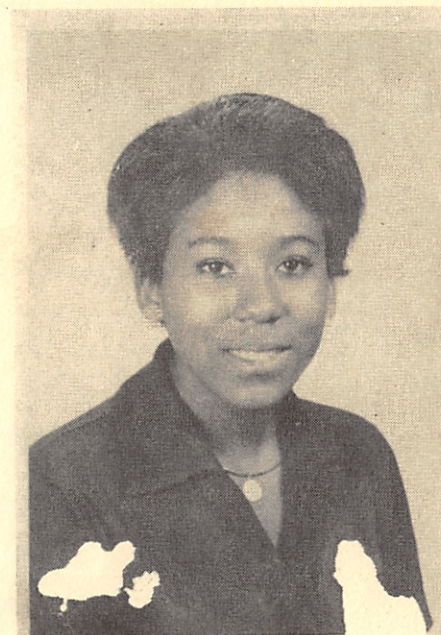
