

Sometimes it seems to me we can sum up the Christian life as living the balanced life. Think of the many ways we are called to do this:

- \* To keep a balance between private prayer and corporate worship. Jesus found time for both. One supplements the other; one is incomplete without the other.
- \* To keep a balance between what we believe and what we do, between faith and action. Nothing so weakens our Christian witness as a gulf between what we say and what we do.
- \* To keep a balance between respect for tradition and readiness to accept change as inevitable in changing times. This kind of change is needed in all areas of life, but especially in Church life.
- \* To keep a balance between the rightful use of money for personal and family needs and our obligations as stewards to give in proportion to our ability to God and His work.
