To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That for and in consideration of

one Pound of sterling money paid by George Thomas into the treasury for the use of this State, WE HAVE GRANTED, and by these presents DO GRANT unto Thomas his heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land containing six hundred and twenty seven acres surveyed for him the 27th July 1787 situated in the District of Charleston on the waters of Lake Raven born being by a line running North West by land surveyed for John Hill and Robert Colman on North East by land surveyed for Craig North West West by land surveyed for Thomas McLister West and North West by land surveyed for John Carter all other sides by vacant land

having such shape, form and marks as are represented by a plan herunto annexed, together with all woods, trees, water, water courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances and conditions whatsoever thereto belonging. And we have granted unto the said tract of six hundred and twenty seven acres of land, and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said George Thomas his heirs and assigns forever, in fee and complete right.

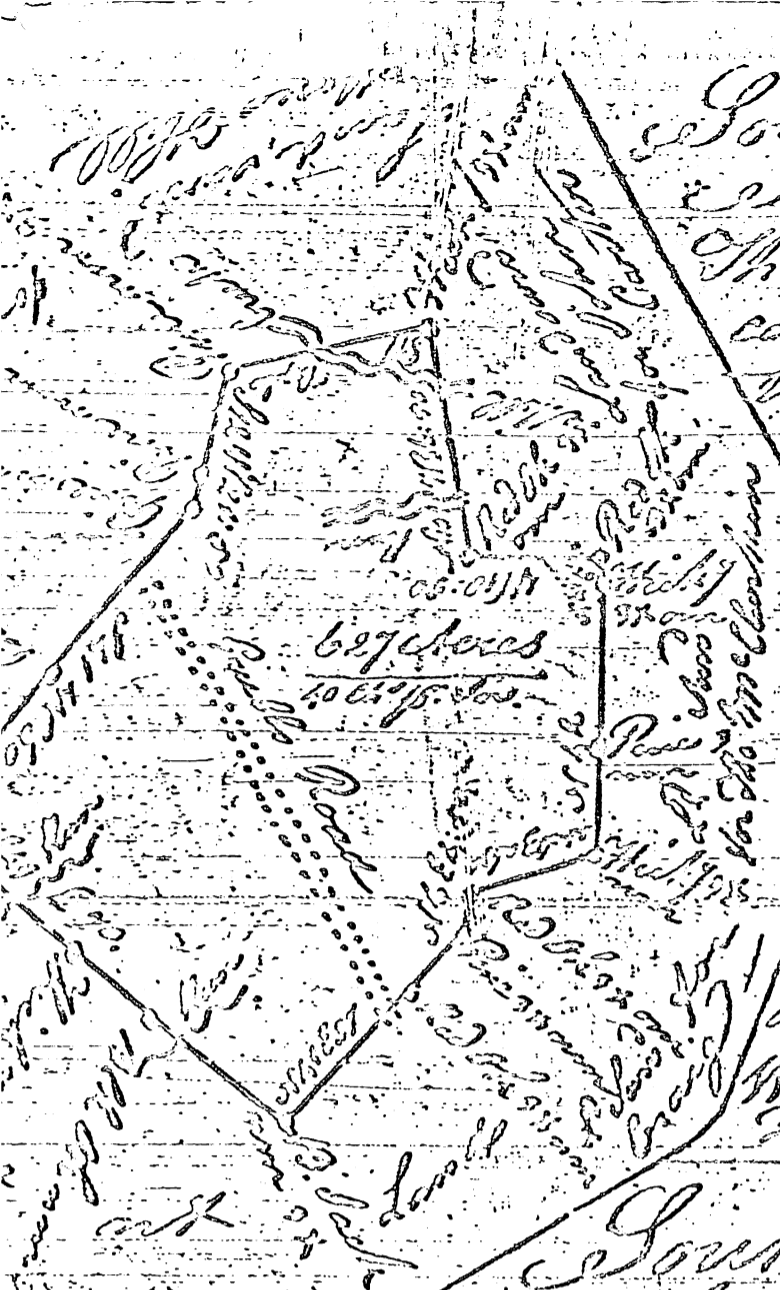
