
When I Must Leave You

RICHARD HENRY THOMAS, JR. AUGUST 23, 1946 - SEPTEMBER 11, 2007

Richard "Ricky" Henry Thomas, Jr. was born in Columbia, S. C., on August 23, 1946 and died September 11, 2007

He was a son of Quay W. and Lucy L. McMaster and the late Richard H. Thomas, Sr.

Rick was a graduate of Greenbrier School and served in the U. S. Marine Corps. He retired from South Carolina Electric and Gas and was the owner of Thomas Garage.

He was a lifelong member of Greenbrier United Methodist Church, founding member and president of the Greenbrier-Bethel Volunteer Fire Department, past president of the Fairfield Service Center Advisory Council of the American Red Cross and the Fairfield County Council on Aging. He served on the board of the Central South Carolina Chapter of the American Red Cross and volunteered with numerous services and civic organizations including the United Way and the Fairfield Community Food Bank.

Surviving are his wife of 17 years, Mary Lou Coates Thomas; two daughters, Laura Thomas and Dawn (John) Broadway; one son, James Quay Thomas; and one granddaughter, Amanda Broadway.

He was predeceased by his father, Richard H. Thomas, Sr. and a brother, James Myer Thomas.
