DR. J. L. THOMPSON, 86, SUCCUMBS IN COLUMBIA

COLUMBIA, S. C., Sept. 24.—(AP)—Dr. James Lawrence Thompson, 86, died today at the South Carolina State hospital after 59 years' service as physician there. A native of Fairfield county, he had been with the hospital since going there when he was 26 years old.

He is survived by a sister, Mrs. H. T. Boyd of Blackstock; three children, Mrs. C. K. Wright of Columbia, Mrs. J. A. Killian of Knoxville, Tenn., and Lawrence Thompson of Alexandria, Va.
