### TIDWELL, STROTHER

Strother Tidwell is as far back as I have been able to prove this Tidwell line. Strother Tidwell was born about 1796, South Carolina, and died March, 1871. He married Mary Pauline (Polly) Davis, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth (Bishop) Davis. Mary Davis Tidwell was born about 1796 in South Carolina. Mary Pauline (Polly) Davis Tidwell died in 1887. (Her will was proved September 9, 1887, Fairfield Co., S.C.) They are shown from 1829 to 1860 census records in Fairfield Co., South Carolina. They had the following children: Sarah b. c1820, Fairfield Co., S.C. 1. d. never married. 2. Thomas b. c1822, Fairfield Co., S.C. d. m. Fairfield Co., S.C. Equity No. 844, Filed 27 June 1881, we find that Strother Tidwell departed this life March, 1871, leaving a widow and ten surviving children. His widow had set off the home place on Dutchman Creek adjacent to the land of Fletcher Ruff, Nicholas Peay and Tidwell lands.

She will take this in lieu of any other share in the estate. The court orders the sale of the other lands and the proceeds to be divided into ten equal shares--one share for each child or the legal heirs of a deceased child.

Division: Mary Tidwell the home plantation in lieu of any other share David W. Tidwell, son, 1 share and see him as No 3 Thomas Tidwell, son, 1 share James M. Tidwell, son, 1 share John Tidwell, Sr., son, 1 share, also shows as John S. Tidwell Lucy Morrell, wife of William F. Morrell, dau., 1 share Nancy Jane Smith, wife of William G. Smith, dau., 1 share Lizzy Nelson, formerly widow Crowder, wife of Daniel Nelson, dau, 1 share (same as Elizabeth Crowder) Mary Williams, a widow, dau., 1 share Strother Tidwell, Jr., deceased son, 1 share to his children which include John Jr., Susanna, and Philida. (1 name has been left off this record--must be Jacob)

This record was hand copied by Ken Tidwell of Salt Lake City, Utah, from their records there. He is another Tidwell researcher, but he is not a descendant of Strother. He mentions some of this abstracted by Andreas, a South Carolina researcher, now deceased, but who abstracted a lot of records in that state. He may have left out Jacob's name in his copying. We need a copy of the original will.

Mary Tidwell, widow, Fairfield Co., S.C., also left a will. Her will was dated March 22, 1886, and proved September 9, 1887. She listed in her will that John S. Tidwell, son, and executor, was to have all her estate for his "tender care in my old age." This is confusing as my ancester is listed as John Robert and her son. I question the abstracting of the letter S. If there was truely a son John S. who stayed there and cared for this woman, then we must be claiming the wrong ancestor. This needs further research! Or, did she come to Louisiana and live with her son John Robert here.??? There was another son named Strother. Could the "S" have been an "L" and could John have been John Robert S., since the older people in Union Parish said that his name was John Robert?

The oldest record that I have located on a Tidwell in South Carolina was found in CITIZENS AND IMMIGRANTS - S.C., 1768, by Mary Warren, 1980. p. 45 and p. 224 listed Richard Tidwell in Craven Co., S.C. 9/1768. Page 45 indicated that on April 29, 1768, he owned 100 acres on Wateree River.

Charles Owen Johnson, Arlington, Va., has written on the Tidwell family and his works are published in THE VIRGINIA GENEALOGIST. He wrote that "most - if not all - Tidwells in the United States descend from one Richard Tiwell who was in the Northern Neck of Virginia as early as 1657." He also stated that Richard Tidwell married Anna Barnett/Bernard, and they had Peter (b. 1688, probably dead in 1718), Ann, possibly Martha, Richard II (b. ca 1679-80), Robert (died 1761), and John (probably dead in 1715) and all were in Westmoreland Co., Va., in 1683. He listed Richard Tidwell I as the immigrant ancestor.

Records indicate that there were three Revolutionary Soldiers in S.C. by the Tidwell name. They were Edmund, Francis, and Peter. Peter was born about 1750 and died before June 11, 1827 and whose wife was Martha. He served in the militia during 1782.

### TIDWELL, JOHN ROBERT

John Robert Tidwell, son of Strother and Mary Davis Tidwell, was born about 1826, Fairfield Co., S.C. He died between 1880 and 1900 census reports. He is buried in the Wilhite Cemetery but has no grave marker. John Robert Tidwell was called "Johnny" by his friends. He married Charlsey Ann Day July 6, 1846, in Perry Co., Alabama. Charlsey (also spelled Chaldy in some records) Ann Day was the daughter of John Day, formerly of Edgefield Co., S.C. Charlsey/Chaldy died Aug. 30, 1885, Union Parish, and is buried with John Robert Tidwell in the Wilhite Cemetery with no marker to her grave. (As stated by a descendant, Clarice Bullock Wilhite.) (Charlsey's death date was recorded in the Mars Hill Church Records.)

John Robert Tidwell left Fairfield Co., S.C. in the 1840's, along with some of his brothers. They stayed in Perry Co., Alabama, long enough that four of their children were born there--Jefferson, Sarah, Mary Elizabeth, and Strother William. These children were born between 1847 and 1852.

John Robert Tidwell then moved his family to Union Parish, Louisiana, and settled in the Wilhite Community. Hugh Tidwell, another Tidwell researcher who lives in Monroe, La., has searched the land records and found John Robert Tidwell bought land on the road going past the Wilhite Methodist Church, Union Parish, La. Hugh Tidwell has been back to the area in South Carolina where these Tidwells lived before coming to Alabama and Louisiana and stated the area there is very much like the land around Wilhite. Hugh was told by a native of that area that during the Civil War, the Tidwell family was one of the more prominent families there. According to the division of land in Strother Tidwell's will, he must have owned more than 3,000 acres.

Charlsey's descendant, Clarice Bullock Wilhite, related in an interview on this Tidwell line that she recalled Charlsey's name being pronounced "Chalsey."

This couple had the following children:

When his father left South Carolina, he left this child with his own parents. This child was shown in the 1850 census with his grandparents, Strother and Mary Tidwell.

John Lawson Tidwell who was born August 22, 1844 in South Carolina, is listed as the son of John Robert Tidwell, but at this time I have no proof other than a statement from Jeff Tidwell of Wilhite Community. He would have had to have been born before John Robert married Charlsey, yet there is no indication John Robert was married before. Jeff stated the older people used to say that it was always told that John Lawson Tidwell was born in South Carolina and left there when the family started out westward.

When the family settled in Louisiana, the father is supposed to have gone back for John Lawson. John Lawson Tidwell's family Bible records listed his birth date as 1843. The 1850 census for South Carolina, Fairfield Co., listed about 1844, but the 1900 census show it to be 1845. His birth date recorded on his tomb, Wilhite Cemetery, show his birth as 1848. The census records always list his birth as S. C.

Tidwell, Strother (son of Strother Tidwell)

Strother Tidwell was born c1833, Fairfield Co., S.C., to Strother and Mary (Davis) Tidwell. He married November 9, 1852, at Sucarnatchie Bridge, Sumter, Alabama. (Sumter County Democrat Newspaper, Nov. 13, 1852.) Strother married Veronica Virginia Shultz, born c1839, Alabama, and daughter of John and Mary Shultz. Strother died 1861 at Camp Moore, Louisiana, according to a newspaper clipping. Yet, according to <u>Records of La. Conf. Soldiers.</u> VIII, Bk. 2, Strother was a Pvt. in Co. E, 19th La. Inf., Enrolled at Camp Moore, La., December 11, 1861. He reenlisted at Corinth, Mississippi, May 8, 1862. In 1863 he was listed as being ab sent at Hospital, Greenville by order of Dr. Wall. He reenlisted at Dalton, Georgia January 20, 1864. It is not clear to me as to who the Strother was that was listed as dead in 1861.

Strother and Veronica had the following children:

### DAVID WILLIAM TIDWELL

David William Tidwell was born August 24, 1835, Fairfield Co., S.C. to Strother and Mary Davis Tidwell. He died Feb. 8, 1916, Fairfield Co., S.C. David married Martha/Mattie Elizabeth Myers who was born March 2, 1848 and died Dec. 8, 1919. They are buried in Longtown Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Longtown, Fairfield Co., S.C.

Charles E. Thomas wrote in "Longtown," which is included in Bolick's <u>Fairfield Sketchbook</u>, the following:

WISTERIA, the Tidwell-Myers family home, just across from the present Harrison-Dixon home in Longtown, is said to have been saved by Nicholas Peay Myers from the Yankees' torch. It is said that there were `Yankee skulls' in the attic at WISTERIA until Mrs. David William Tidwell (the former Mattie Myers) had them buried with the family and slaves at Bryant Hill Cemetery some time before WISTERIA was accidently burned about 1935.

WISTERIA was one of the fine LONGTOWN plantation houses and was full of history, lore, and tradition. There were grease spots on the walls and even the ceilings of some of the upstairs closets where the Myers and Tidwells hid their hams and pork shoulders before Sherman's raid. These same bedrooms were papered after the war with Confederate money, it having become valueless, and paper being scarce.

WISTERIA was perhaps most noted for its fox hunts, although it is recalled that `the hounds disturbed Mrs. Tidwell's fine Wagnerian ear.'
