## Turnipseed Family Bible

The following entries are written in a German Bible printed at Nürnberg in 1765 (MDCCLXV). The Bible is Martin Luther's translation, and is in the possession of Mr. H. B. Eargle, Columbia, S. C.

[front page]: Elizabeth Smith was Born the 10th Febr 1772.

[back pages]. Felix Turnipseed was married the 22 day of unto Elizabeth Smith 1787[??]

Ann Turnipseed the first Child of Felix Turnipseed and Elizabeth his wife was Born May the 18th Day the year of our Lord 1788

Felix Turnipseed the Second child and first Son of felix Turnipseed and Elizabe[th] was born 22 September 1789

David Turnipseed the third Child and Secund son of Felix Turnipseed and Elizabeth his [ ] was born 25 nov 1791

Daniel Turnipseed was born [torn]
Being the 22d Day of July [illegible ]

Elizabeth Smith was born in the year of our Lord 1772 the 10th day of Feby She being the daughter of Thomas Smith and his wife Catherine Peter Coon and his wife Mary Coon Godfather and Godmother for her.

[N. B. The Turnipseed family was of German origin, having translated the name Rubsamen. Felix Rubsamen signed the petition for incorporation of the church at Cedar Creek called Appli Forum, now Cedar Creek Methodist Church in Richland County.]
