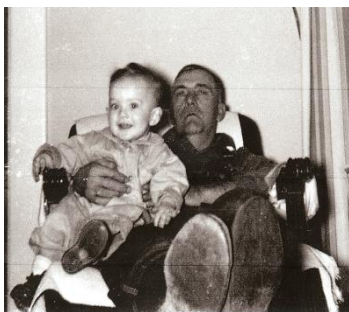

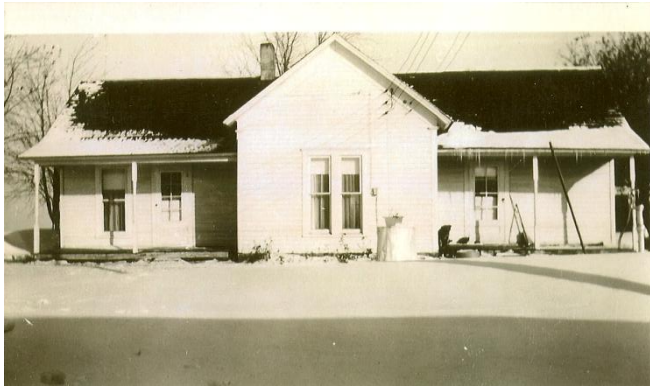

Cyrus passed away at the age of 88, he fell and broke his hip, with complications after surgery. He and his family lived at Coles Station, Illinois on a 40 acre farm until moving to Mattoon and then resided at 3208 Richmond (he had the nicknames of C. A., Hutch and his mother called him Russell as a young boy-also Bev Beck has his name listed as Cyrus Russell Davis). Lillian Delilah passed away at the age of 72 of a heart attack, she had several heart attacks, the first one was at the age of 52. Lillian was a beautiful seamstress, she also did crochet and tatting and quilting, she made her spending money this way. (Lillian kept somewhat of a diary, just hand written notes with some dates of various things which I think is very interesting as it is all about the family. I also have a hand written (ledger type form) dated 1917 for automobile expenses, that I believe were from Hutch.) Lillian also had hand written recipes in a ledger as well, so will include some of them. One of them says it was from her mother, so am including it under Hattie Stull Perry excerpt. Hope you find this interesting. Lillian also loved Christmas's and every year made clothes for all of her grandchildren, a lot of times causing her to have her heart attacks, because she worked so hard for this, but it gave her great pleasure.

One of Lillian's favorite recipes was:

Grandma Davis' Sugar Cookies

1 C butter	½ teas. Almond flavoring
1 ¾ C powdered sugar	1 teas vanilla
1 egg	2 ½ C flour
1 teas cream of tartar	1 teas soda

Cream butter and sugar. Add egg and flavorings-mix well. Mix dry ingredients separately and add to cream mixture, mix well. Refrigerate 2-3 hours. Bake at 375 degrees for 7-8 minutes.

MATTOON — Cyrus Alvin "Hutch" Davis, 88, formerly of 3208 Richmond Ave., Mattoon, died at 9 a.m. Monday at the Mattoon Manor Nursing Home.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete at the Mitchell-Jerdan Funeral Home Mattoon.

Mr. Davis was born April 26, 1891, in Moultrie County, near Coles, a son of Frank Pierce and Betty Waggoner Davis. He married Lillian D. Perry on June 29, 1912, in Terre Haute. She died July 19, 1967.

Surviving are three sons, Frank P. and Richard W., both of Mattoon, and Robert E. of Henderson, Nev.; three daughters: Mrs. Orris (Helen) Lilly of Sullivan, Mrs. William (Charlotte) Louthan of Mattoon and Mrs. Robert T. 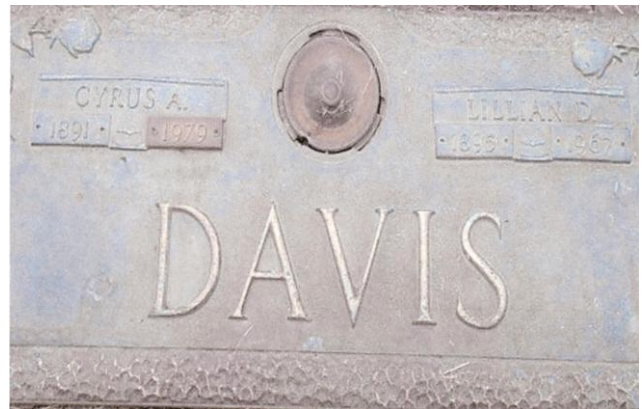
