Good Morning,

I have been working from Kansas with Bill Gregory in Chester County, SC on the various Walker lines. Specifically my line is from Col. Wm. b. 1812 and Rachel Eliza [McCullough] Walker b. 1814. Bill visited the Chester courthouse and sent me any information he found about Walkers of Chester County. He included some information from names we associate with my line that he thought might be pertinent.

We have ended up with 4 files and one chart of information pertaining mostly to Walkers in Chester. We put most of the information into a Timeline format. Now we want to get the information out where it can be seen. It is currently done in the latest version of Libre Office. I was told that is almost a universal program to submit right now, but am running into resistance from some of the relatives I have tried to send it to. The four files contain 164 pages that when printed double-sided need 82 pages of paper. The chart needs 12 pages printed double-sided.

My question is will you accept these reports for your library and will you accept them written in Libre Office on a CD/DVD format? Could you accept them via email? After all this work we want to be sure that the libraries we submit to make the information available to researchers.

We thought it might be helpful to offer this information to the counties surrounding Chester since I don't know where my Walkers came from.

I have briefly taken a look at our information pertaining to the name Walker in Fairfield County. The earliest I saw was a Drury Walker born 1776 in Scotland who married a Margaret Bailey born 1776 in Chester, SC. I do not see the name William among any of the descendants though. There were also some McCulloughs in Fairfield. We have a will of a Thomas made in 1843 and that of an Elizabeth made in 1848.
