January 8, 1901 Issue

Miss Azabah Agnew, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. B. Agnew to Mr. Thomas D. Wallace, by the Rev. J. H. Wilson.

February 15, 1905 Issue

March 17, 1869 Issue

Charles Wallace, editor of the Warrenton, Ga. Clipper, was shot and killed on the 12th inst. by Dr. G. W. Darden.

June 30, 1869 Issue

Dr. Peter M. Wallace, editor of the Spartanburg Gazette, died on the 6th instant at the Spartanburg Court House, at the age of about 72.

September 28, 1870 Issue

Mr. Willis Wallace, Laurens County, died suddenly last week.

March 8, 1883 Issue

Mrs. A. S. Wallace died at the residence of her son-in-law, Mr. Calvin Brice, in this county on Saturday from typhoid fever. She was the wife of **Hon. A. S. Wallace** and was buried in York County

October 3, 1888 Issue

Mary Wallace, the youngest child of **Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Wallace**, aged three years, died on Sunday. The funeral services were held at the Presbyterian Church.

January 14, 1891 Issue

The remains of **Captain Geo. D. Wallace**, who was killed in the late fight with the Indians in South Dakota, arrived in Yorkville on a special train on January 5th, in charge of **Col. R. M. Wallace**. He was buried in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

August 9, 1893 Issue

Dr. Wallace McAlily, of Chester, died on the 8th, from a relapse of typhoid fever. He was a son of Capt. Wm. McAlily and a grandson of the late **Hon. A. S. Wallace**.

January 10, 1894 Issue

Mrs. Rebecca Witherspoon Wallace, wife of Dr. John Wallace, died at her home near Wallaceville. She was a Miss Witherspoon of Darlington.

January 17, 1894 Issue

Mrs. M. M. Evans died at the residence of her son-in-law, Mr. W. J. Elliott, on Tuesday. She was the relict of Mr. Jno. W. Evans, who died about the year 1886 and a sister of the late Gladney P. Martin and Mrs. E. S. Davis, the latter being the only living member of the family at present. She was about sixty-nine years of age. She was buried in the Salem Presbyterian Church Cemetery. Her death made a double bereavement to the family of Mr. A. M. Wallace. Mrs. Dr. Wallace, the mother of Mr. Wallace, preceded Mrs. Evans, who is Mrs. A. M. Wallace's mother, only about twenty hours.

September 8, 1897 Issue

Dr. John Wallace died on Monday at his home near Wallaceville in this county. He was 81 year of age.

November 24, 1897 Issue

Mr. J. W. Wallace was killed by a train several days ago. He was the son of Dr. John Wallace and leaves a wife and five children.

December 29, 1897 Issue

Mr. J. W. Wallace was run over by a train and killed. He leaves a wife and five children.

January 15, 1902 Issue

Mrs. Sallie Wallace died in Chester on Dec. 31st at the age of 99.

February 15, 1905 Issue

Mrs. Fannie Colter Wallace, widow of Col. William Wallace, died in Columbia, on the 9th. She was the daughter of Dr. David Harper Means and Fannie M. Colter. On the paternal side she was the niece of Gov. John H. Means and the Rev. Robert Means. On the maternal side she was the niece of Col. Wm. C. Preston, of Chancellor William Harper, David Gambrill, governor of Missouri, and Edwin Bates, who was the attorney general of Missouri. She was born on September 21, 1835 in Fairfield County. On March 10, 1859 she married Dr. John Glover Mobley. After Dr. Mobley died she married Col. William Wallace on Dec. 21, 1876. She leaves only a son, Hon. John G. Mobley of Fairfield County. She was buried in the Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

May 24, 1905 Issue

Mr. Calvin Brice died at his home near Woodward on Saturday at the age of 73. He was a member of Co. H, Sixth South Carolina Regiment. He was buried in the New Hope A. R. P. Church Cemetery. He leaves his wife, who was a daughter of the late **A. S. Wallace** of York County, and the following children: R. Geo. Brice of Charlotte, N. C. Mac Brice of Yorkville, Mrs. T. W. Brice Jr., Miss Ruth Brice, Bert Brice, Hon A. Homer Brice, all of Woodward. Two brothers, J. A. Brice of Winnsboro, and Wm. W. Brice of Micanopy, Florida and one sister, Mrs. J. M. Galloway of Corsicana, Texas.
