By act of the General Assembly, 8th March
1784, John Wim, Richard Wim and John
Vanderhorst were authorized to have
Wimulow laid out as a town. It was
incorporated Dec. 20th 1832. The charter
was granted on 13th Feb 1777, by the
General Assembly to John Wim, Robert
Ellison and Wm. Strather.

Minor Wim married sister of David
R. Ewan. He was a son of Col. John Wim. He
was an unprincipled man and Mr. Ewan
induced his sister to separate from him.
Mrs. Wim and her daughter taught school
for some years on the Gen. Wim lot
This was second generation Minor
Wim about 1813 - 1814. Mrs. Wim
was named Mary.

Wimulow was named for Col. John and
Gen. Richard Wim. Col. John Wim was a
high toned, honorable man. Col. John Wim
owned most of the land around Wimulow
and lived at the south end of town.

General Richard Wim had the record as
Colonel in the Revolution. He was a true
patriot and perhaps fought as many battles
and with as firm a heart as any man
living or dead. He filled a seat in Congress
for many years.

Mrs. Wim's maiden name was Blocker, an
Edgington family.

Wells in his Statistics of S.C. says Gen.
Richard Wim was also a native of Virginia

Will dated 16 Jan 1781, proved 4 March 1782, son John S rd of tract where I formerly lived in Georgia, adj Wm. Graves Bennett, Stevens; son Peter N. side of above tract in Ga.; grandson Thomas Bacon; nephew Joseph Wynn; sons John and Peter and friend Thomas Baker Esrs. wit Naemie Hampton (x) John Bacon, Henry Wheeler.

He is also mentioned as being justice of peace and named in witness or inventory of several wills.

Minor and Richard also mentioned as witnesses.

In Hill - Mabley - Hill Connections Capt John Wynn is mentioned as being at Auburn, Bufords Ferry and Four Holes Bridge also in expedition against Stone
