1. Minor Winn - from Wales to Fauquier Co., Va  
Will dated 7/1/75 early 1700s
- a. Son William - left a negro
  - b. Son Minor, Jr - (his executor) - <sup>(Remained in Va.)</sup> 2 slaves
  - c. Son John - left 3 slaves
  - d. Son James - " 2 slaves <sup>(Settled near Louisville, Ky.)</sup>
  - e. Son Richard - " 2 slaves
  - f. Dau. Margaret Johnson - 2 slaves
  - g. Dau. Mary Smith - share of estate
  - h. Dau. Susanner Grant - 1 slave
  - i. Dau. Elizabeth Smith - (pre-deceased father)

John, eldest son of Minor, SR, Wm., and Richard  
Come to Fairfield from Va. about 1765

Minor, JR remained in Fauquier Co., Va., - died in 1813

d. Christina (m. DR Wm. Bratton) - buried Presb. Cem.

July 3, 1793 -

Minor Winn (John's son) Sold to John Means : 117 acres } 80 pds Sterling  
100 acres on Rocky Creek }

Jan<sup>30</sup> (1798?) Sold 285 acres to Thomas Means  
32 lbs, 10 shillings sterling on Cedar CR.

By 1811 John was living in Rutherford Co., Tenn.

Oct 11, 1811 John sold Dr. Wm. Brutton 18 acres next to the College lands + next to lands of Thomas Means.

Dec. 8, 1813 John Winn made his will in Rutherford Co., Tenn - died in late 1813 or 1814.

(No record of burial place)

Son, Minor, died between 1824 and 1826. No record

Wm's daughter, Mary, m. Robt Starke of Va. - They had 9 children, (his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife <sup>Mary Hay</sup> gave him 11 more)  
Starke m. 3<sup>rd</sup> time (Grace Baker) He died in 1830 and is buried in Trinity Churchyard.

"John, Rich, & Minor Winn, 3 bros, moved from Va. to this dist before Rev. War. Gen. Rich fought in more battles than any other Whig in S.C. Col. John & Minor were prisoners of Cornwallis during his stay in Winn's bar. They were under sent. of death, being charged with trying to ambush & kill Cornwallis. They were released thru influence of Col. John Phillips, a Loyalist, who returned to Ireland,

Rich. moved to Duell Town, Tenn, in 1812.  
I. have never known what became of Minor, youngest of the 3 bros. He was Dist. Surveyor in 1784.  
Gen. Stonewall Jackson's maternal grandfather was named Minor Winn - prob. a cousin of our 3 Winns.
