of your Regiments at Beversreeke on Wednesday  
the 30<sup>th</sup> of this Inst. Tho' if you can make  
it convenient I had much rather the  
Reviews should be at Granby,

The Governor & myself will be at  
the Review, I shall go into particulars you  
being an Old Officer, Only beg leave to  
Mention that it will be Military for your  
Officers & Men to Appear in the best Manner,  
if the Officers have not Side Arms let  
them take Guns, you will direct your  
Capts to make you Accurate Returns  
of their Companies on the day of Review

As it is possible your Regiments may  
not be fully Offic'd I have herewith sent  
you Ten Blanks Commissions, which you  
will please to have fill'd up & delivered

to Such Gentlemen as may be Appointed, Observing  
to Commission no person but such that will  
have a true Sense of these Appointments

You will Also Receive Ten Quarts of  
Militia Law's which you will distribute  
to your Officers, I shall leave All Other  
Matters to your good judgement,
