JOHN WIMM

In the Name of God amen I John Wimm of St Parish of South Carolina Planter being Indespos but of Sound Minde and memory, calling to mind my mortality, and knowing that it is appointed to all Men to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner and form, that is to say committing my Soul unto the hands of god that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be Burried with a decent and Christian like manner at the Deferition of my Executors. Imprimis I will that all my lawfull Debts and funeral Charges be paid

Item I give to my beloved son John Wimm one wench called Shartoll and one wench Called Jenny with all there Children one fellow called ^{Frank} Frank and one fellow Caled Bouston & One Wench Called Lousy & One Wench Called Hannah with all there Childrun to him and his Heirs forever

Item My will is that my Tract of land where I formerly lived in Georgia be Divided by Treking a stright line from the water Oak Corner (Nearest to Mr. Wm. Graves) to Tennetes Old Corner & Continued to Strike Mr. Stevens line, As the corners will appear upon a plat or grant One that all the South Side I give to My Deloved Son John Wimm and ^{his} upon the North Side I give to my Son Peter Wimm and his heirs for ever.

Item I give to my beloved son ^{Peter} ~~Richard~~ Wimm three Negroe Wenches by name big Nancy Nelly, little Nancy with there Issue and Sam and ^{and Joe} ~~and Joe~~, Caizer & Abram, To his ~~his~~ heirs forever

Item I also give to my Son John Wimm two fellows by Name Wally and Sampson

Item I give to my grand son Thomas Bacon One Negroe follers by name Prime and one Wench by Name Silvey

and her two Childrens, If My Grand Son Thomas Bacon Die without a Lawfull begotten hiere than the Said Negroes shall return to my Proper Heirs_.

Item It is my will that Charles and Will be Sold and Divided at the Discretion of My Executors

Item It is my will that a Negroe Girl be Bought & given to my Nephew Joseph Winn as Mentioned in my Wifes late Will and that she be paid for, out of my Estate

Item It is also my will that all the Remainder part of my Estate both Real & personal be Equally Divided between my two Sons, John & Peter_.

Lastly I Ordain and appoint my beloved Sons John Winn and Peter Winn and my friend Thomas Baker Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby Declaring this and no other to be So

Published pronounced and declared to be the last will and Testament of the Said John Winn this Sixteenth of January in the year of Our lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty One
