

Minor (MINOR) Winn, Senior father of several boys
settled in Charleston village 1784. He was born
1704 - Died 1778. Came from Fougner Co. Virginia.

His son, Richard, born 1750 Fougner Co. Virginia
died 1818 in Tennessee, and brother, John, came to
what is Fairfield County as young boys. They

later took out large land grants in western
Fairfield in the Turner neighborhood - Again
adding to their generous holdings near Waverly
in and around what is now the village of
Waverly so named because Richard Winn

gave the land on which the town is built.
He was a brave and fine man being captain
of a company in the struggle against England.

On March 8, 1764 John Winn, Richard
Winn and John Vandever were authorized
by the General Assembly to lay out the
town of Waverly - John Vandever host of
Charleston, originally - joining funds to aid
the project. It was incorporated as a town

December 20, 1832.

After the defeat of Cornwallis at Kings Mountain,
October 1780 until January 1781.

February 13, 1777 Mt. Zion Literary Society
granted to Mt. Zion College; as they realized
the effort to get large buildings from town
bonds for \$175,000.
