I think you would find it worth while going to WINNSBOROUGH, FAIRFIELD, CO.S.C. and seeing Winn-Dee home of Richard Winn I think the Cathcart family may still be there? Some may be gone by now? They where very helpful as I have been to thier home two times and helped with Winn info each time. John winns home is most likely gone now as it was in bad repair last time I was there. Our William and his brothers surveyed and bought and sold most of the land there. They all mainly lived around WINNSBOROUGH, FAIRFIELD, co.s.c. Columbia was surveyed by them as well and William owned land up to and Senate street. I have family there yet. See the (Preston house) as that is our family via Winn and Hamptons. John and family moved to clark and Madison Co. Ky. then to Missouri. Not

many family members around there a lot of cousins by other names/ Chappell?

Are you aware of the correlation and overall relation ship to the Winn brothers and this movie? (MADISON 0.7)

Lord Cornwallis made his headquarters at Winnsborough S.C. and the Officer who forced Cornwallis to release certain Patriots was Col. Richard Winn and the one held was Brother Col. John Winn. See in the book by cousin Dr. Buford S. Chappell, MD, The Winns of Fairfield County; page 90 The records of the Winn Brothers is well worth reading and interesting when one sees the movie after having the background of the John, Richard and William Winn. Mel Gibson is really playing the role of Gen. Richard Winn as he was to become! "Col. Richard Winn told Cornwallis that if he hung Col. John Winn, that he would hang the first 100 British officers and soldiers that fell into his hands- and at that time he had several. " Winn was pardoned and property repaid!

William Winn was born in VIRGINIA. He was Received precept for land (not settled) - William Winn on 3 May 1768 in Little River and Wateree Creek, South Carolina. He was Land certified for William Winn on 5 Sep 1769 in Wateree Creek, South Carolina. He was Received 300 acres land grand - Wm. Winn on 8 Sep 1770 in Wateree Creek, South Carolina. He was Sold land -Willima & Rosey/Rosmon Winn on 18 Sep 1770 in Wateree Creek, South Carolina. He was Received precept for land - William Winn on 8 Mar 1771 in Qwen Mill Creek, South Carolina. He was Plat certified for William Winn on 2 Feb 1773 in Owen Mill Creek, South Carolina. He was Surveyed land for self - William Winn, D.S on 6 Apr 1773 in Enoree River, South Carolina. He was Received land grant on 23 May 1773 in Moons Creek, South Carolina. He was Certified plat on 28 May 1773 in Enoree River, South Carolina. He resided on 27 Mar 1775 in Camden District., South Carolina. He was Appointed Matthew Smith power of attorney for affairs in Fauquier Co., VA on 27 Mar 1775. He resided in 1778 in SOUTH CAROLINA. Third son of Minor Winn and Margaret Conner, born 1732. He went with his brothers, Colonel John Winn and Major General Richard Winn to South Carolina in 1764 where they settled in Cauden District called Fairfield, and laid out the town of Winnsboro, South Carolina.



Colonel William Winn was living at "76," a town and military station in western South Carolina in 1790. He served with distinction in the Revolutionary War, returned to Virginia and moved to Lexington, Kentucky. Colonel William Winn lived in Craven, now Spartenburg, South Carolina and lastly in Charleston, South Carolina.



he is buried beside the first wife, Dorthea Wright, of his brother, Colonel John Winn at Winnsboro, South Carolina.

The deed book 6, p. 134, Fauquier County, Virginia. William Winn of Craven County, South Carolina appointed his son-in-law, Matthew Smith of Fauquier County, VA his attorney. Matthew Smith had married Martha Winn who was the remaining heiress of Ann Lingan whom William Winn referred to as his former wife. This power of attorney was witnessed by James Winn, Minor Winn Sr.

Colonel William Winn married two times. First Ann Lingan of Baltimore, Maryland about 1753 and they had one daughter, Martha, who married Matthew Smith of Fauquier County, Virginia. He married second about 1764, Rosa Hampton, daughter of John Hampton and Margaret Wade of Fairfax County, Virginia, an aunt of General Wade Hampton.

Colonel William Winn and Rosa Hampton had four sons and six daughters namely: Rosa Winn, Margaret Winn, Mary Winn, Sarah Winn, Rebecca Winn, Susan Winn, John David Winn, James Winn, William Winn and Minor Winn IV. He was married to Rosamond (Rosa or Rosey) HAMPTON about 1756 in VIRGINIA.

Rosamond (Rosa or Rosey) HAMPTON was born on 8 Sep 1735 in VIRGINIA. She resided in 1800 in Fairfield Co., South Carolina. She died 1810 in Fairfield Co., South Carolina. Aunt of General Wade Hampton. Children were:

- i. Rosa WINN resided in KENTUCKY.
- ii. Margaret WINN.
- iii. Mary WINN was born about 1764 in FAUQUIER COUNTY, VIGINIA.
- iv. Sarah WINN died on 20 Apr 1807 in COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA.

VI. John David WINN was born in 1758. He resided in 1819 in HOWARD Co., MISSOURI. He died in 1820 in Glasgow, Howard Co., Missouri. He resided in KENTUCKY. He was Served in Rev. War. MOVED TO NEAR RICHMOND, KENTUCKY AND LATER TO MISSOURI, NEAR GLASGOW WHERE HE DIED AND IS BURIED.

I would like to see notes and discussion on the Life of our Winn family as there is much to be shared; more than just the names and dates.

What I have learned of Minor Winn and Margaret Connor (O' had been dropped) of Fauquier Co. Va.

The Winn's were great horsemen and very active land traders foremost! Virginian plantation life and agriculture are reflected throughout the notes handed down. The care and management of many crops and animals are of interest. Livestock at the Winn estates included cattle, chickens, hogs, horses, and sheep. Crops included corn, cotton, grasses, hay, hemp, tobacco, grapes, nuts, fruits and wheat. The many garden crops and the ornamentals of Mrs.Winn are also somewhat documented. They were active in the sale of crops as noted in accounts, bills of lading, and correspondence documenting charges, commissions, prices, and ships and shipping in several ports. The Winn's were owners of slaves and their quarters, houses, barns, mills, ferry, and a very early distillery, from which much income came of this

enterprize. Minor owned several buildings in the local towns as well. Correspondence and accounts detail the construction and maintenance of mills, the purchase of millstones, and the activities of millers. We have detailed instructions for the preparation of wheat for wagoning to mill, mentioning the need for putting it into bags the morning of shipment, not the night before, as rats would cut the bags to pieces. Alternative crops to tobacco were often sought, as noted in consideration of the crop of hemp to be made at "Grey Stone". This home is still there and the name "Winn" over the mantel piece.

Important culture interests have been documented in lists of plantation supplies and household goods purchased in England and America. Particularly noteworthy is the extensive purchase of books and other items for the family and their education, as the Winn brothers were to become surveyors of note ie. Fairfield County S.C.. Purchases of goods and services from neighbors and local artisans are also documented. Farm implements and tools were purchased regularly, and innovations and changes can be followed in the records. Minor Winn left much land and money to his children etc. Slaves were handed as we have seen from his will.

I look forward to the notes of others from you! And I will gather together the information I have on William Winn (and his wife Rosamond Hampton) son of Minor and Margaret Connor. The Hampton family one of America's most important early families!
