Frame 380 – 1825 #14 – Bill of Complaint – Filed June 7, 1824

Henry R. Taylor and wife
vs.
Saml. S. Taylor and Jeremiah Taylor

Martha Kirkland married Henry R. Taylor on January 14, 1823, she was the daughter of William Kirkland. She was a minor when William died and Samuel S. Taylor, her cousin became her guardian. Jeremiah Taylor was the father of Samuel S. Taylor.

Frame 399 – 1825 #12 – Petition for Guardianship – Filed June 17, 1825

George B. Pearson petitioned to have two guardianships revoked.

Frame 401 – 1825 #13 – Report – Filed June 18, 1825

William Strother's report of his guardianship of John and Osmund Woodward.

Frame 406– 1825 # 15 – Report – Filed June 17, 1825

William Strother's petition on handling the estate of John W. Durham, John Woodward, Sr. and Harvel Durham were John W. Durham's grandfathers.

Frame 408 – 1825 #16 – Petition for Guardianship – Filed June 13, 1825

Thomas Starke appointed guardian of minor Rugely children.

Frame 410 – 1825 #17 – Petition – Filed June 13, 1825

Jane Williamson had separated from her husband and wanted to settle James Craig, her father's estate.
