In the name of God Amen the thirtenth Day of October
In the year of our Lord 1734 I Thomas Simson of Prince
William County Carpenter being very sick wth of Body
but Perfect in mind and memory thanks be to Almighty
God for it and calling to mind the mortality of my Body
and knowing ^{that} it is appointed for all men one to die I doe
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is
to say Principally and first of all I give and recomend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and for my Body
I recomend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and a
deacent manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing count-
ing but at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty Power of God as touching such worldly Estate where
with it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and
dispose of the same in the following manner and form
Item I give and bequeth unto my oldest son William Simson one
hundred and twenty three ^{acres} of Land where he now living on both sides

sik Creek likewise one breeding mare one feather bed bolster rug
and two blankets one Iron Pot six plates and six spoons

Item I give and bequeth unto my loving Daughter Mary Woodard
one hundred Acres of Land where she is now seated and lying on the
north side of Sande run to her and the Heirs of her Body for ever

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COMMENTS BY ROBERT HILL... In this paragraph it shows the daughter MARY WOODWARD is son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward NOT ELIZABETH as records show... also note a sister named ANN WOODWARD... never heard of her before

Item I give and bequeth unto my ever loving wife Jane Simson all my Plantacion and liberty of one hundred acres of Land where I now live her life and after her deceas to fall to my son Baater I also give her the Priviledg of the whole tract for Timber for the use of the Plantation I also leave my wife all my moveable Estate except the legacies herein before mentioned and leave my wife whole and sole executer of this my last Will and Testament and further I leave my three Children Baater Simson and Thomas Simson to be brought up till they come to the age of Eighteen Years and likewise my Daughter Ann till she come of age by my wife Jane Simson I further leave my Daughter Ann to Mary Woodward in case her mother dies before she comes of age I further give unto my wife two negroes during her life and after her Deceas for to be equally divided among my Children and I doe hereby utterly disallow revoke and disanul all and every


I further leave my Daughter Ann to Mary Woodard in case
