

Andrews28210@Bellsouth.Net WO81° 03:465 In 1998 Ed Arnette walked me to the sight of Jessie's original burial site and at that time we agreed to try and have a marker installed. It was after Ed died that I was able to get the Veterans Administration to furnish this marker. I intended to put the marker in place but age has taken me over and I now realize that I will not be able to do it. So I am passing the chore to someone else, maybe you can find. The grave site is located off of Highway 200 near the address of 2195 Highway 200. The GPS location is as follows: N 34 24,094-W 81 03,576. If you go online at Boulter.com/gps/ an arrow will display the location on a map. At utility pole #1872 go about 100-200 paces perpendicular to highway 200 and it should be close by. This location confirms a note written by Mrs. Arnette stating that she could "see Jessie's grave site from her house" There is a big tree growing out of the grave site. In the 1990s my son and I "cleared off" the site and attempted to reconstruct it with the bricks left when the slab was moved. Colebrating Two Contuniors W 81° 03.465
