

ASITHAPPENED

IN EARLY SUMMER OF 1780, A SMALL BAND OF WHIG MILITIA UNDER JOHN MCCLURE, RICHARD WINN, WILLIAM BRATTON, EDWARD LACEY, AND ANDREW NEAL ATTACKED AND DISPERSED A GATHERING OF LOCAL TORY MILITIA GATHERED AT MOBLEY'S MEETING HOUSE NEAR THIS LOCATION IN WESTERN FAIRFIELD COUNTY. THE AFFRAY DID NOT LAST LONG, IT ESSENTIALLY BEING AN AMBUSH AND RECAPTURE OF THE LIVESTOCK AND POSSESSIONS STOLEN FROM AREA RESIDENTS BY LOYALIST (TORY) MILITIAMEN AND BRITISH TROOPS. CASUALTIES WERE SLIGHT.

THIS EARLY MORNING SKIRMISH HAPPENED JUST ON THE HEELS OF ANOTHER LOCAL ROUT OF TORIES AND BRITISH SOLDIERS AT BECKHAMVILLE (OR ALEXANDER'S OLD FIELD) NEAR PRESENT-DAY GREAT FALLS A FEW DAYS BEFORE. IN JULY, SOME OF THESE SAME PLAYERS AGAIN TOOK PART IN THE DEFEAT OF CAPTAIN CHRISTAIN HUCK AND HIS TROOPS OF BRITISH LEGION DRAGOONS, NEW YORK VOLUNTEERS, AND LOYALIST MILITIAMEN AT WILLIAMSON'S PLANTATION NEAR BRATTONSVILLE.

CHARLESTON HAD BEEN CAPTURED BY THE BRITISH IN MARCH OF 1780 AND THE PICTURE HAD BEEN GLOOMY FOR THE AMERICAN CAUSE UNTIL EVENTS LIKE THESE BEGAN POPPING IN RAPID SUCCESSION IN THE ONCE- QUIET BACKCOUNTRY OF THE CAROLINAS. BY FALL OF 1781 THE BRITISH UNDER LORD CORNWALLIS HAD BEEN BADLY BEATEN AND SURRENDERED AT YORKTOWN. TODAY'S BATTLE REEN-ACTMENT CELEBRATES THE 225TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION'S ENGAGEMENTS IN THE BACKCOUNTRY.

LOGAN, AM. THIS BOOK WAS FOUND IN THE LIBRARY COLLECTION OF THE MUSEUM DIRECTOR'S GREAT GRANDFATHER AND IS A MUCH SOUGHT-AFTER TREATISE ON THE HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF OUR AREA. LOGAN PUBLISHED VOLUME I IN 1859, BUT THE WARTIME EVENTS OF 1861-1864 THWARTED HIS EDITING OF COLLECTED EYE-WITNESS NARRATIVES OF THE REVOLUTION FOR A SECOND VOLUME. SOME OTHERS ATTEMPTS TO PUBLISH VOLUME II IN LATER TIMES WERE UNSUCCESSFUL.
