The following is a list of Lyles from South Carolina that died in the service of the Confederacy. The list was taken from: THE ROLL OF THE DEAD, published by the S.C. Dept of Archives and History. Copyright 1994, first edition, 500 copies published.

Wallace W. Lyles, Fairfield, age 19, rank not shown, Co. E, 15th. S.C. Killed in action Sept. 15, 1862. Can not read place of death, but it looks like Bomelon, Md.

Jas. B. Lyles, Fairfield, age 24, corporal, Co. E, 15th. S.C. Killed in action July 28, 1864, Deep Bottom, Va.

Wm. Boyken Lyles, Fairfield, age 26, Capt., Co. H, 6th S.C. Killed in battle of Seven Pines, Va. May 31, 1862.

H.J. Lyles, Fairfield, age 46, Pvt., Co. H., 6th. S.C. Died Sept. 23, 1862 at Germantown, Va..

^{Austin} Arthur P. Lyles, Fairfield, age 20, Corporal, Co. H, 6th S.C.

William Woodward Lyles, Fairfield, age 19, Pvt. Co. H, 6th. S.C. Died Oct. 16, 1864, (WDS RD ???), at Fort Harrison.

Thomas H. Lyles, Newberry, age 22, Capt., Co. B, Griggs' 1st. S.C.N. Killed Dec. 18, 1862, in the battle of Fredricksburg.

George H. Lyles, Lancaster, age 18, Pvt., Co. E. Griggs' 12th. SCN. May 10, 1864, Killed at Sporsylvania Court House.

Erskine Lyles, Newberry, age 24, Pvt. Co. B, Griggs' 1st. SCN. Killed at Warrenton, Va., Sept. 8, 1862.

J.E. Lyles, Newberry, age 24, Pvt., Co. B, Griggs' 3rd. SCN. Killed at Richmond, Va. April 22, 1862.

Could not read the first of the letters following "Griggs"
It could have been OCN, or SCN. I assume it was SCN.

A total of 10 Lyles from South Carolina died for the cause.

I ran accross the Lyles while looking up the Hobbs dead.
