Your Charts and Family Histories Now Preserved In the Caroliniana Library

We are in the fourth year of our newsletter and we have had many family charts published. We have also had two short family sketches published so far and another is promised. We hope to have many more family histories and charts submitted.

The good news is, all of our previous Newsletters have now been placed in the Caroliniana Library at the University of South Carolina and will, therefore, be available for future genealogists to use.

If you are like most amateur genealogists you have a growing file of material and it has occurred to you that you really need to put it together in a book. And you should. The problem with that is most of us don't complete that book and the material is often lost by our heirs and assigns after we are gone. Thank of all the years of work that are wasted! And then someone else comes along and has to duplicate that labor all over again.

But, if you submit a family sketch to the Fairfield Newsletter there will be at least some of your work published and placed in a well known genealogical library. Also, if you sit down and do a family sketch, say a few pages, it can serve as an outline for the book you should do--it will help you get started.

You can submit a family history up to eight pages and we would be glad to publish it. Try to include those things that are documentable and if you include (and you should) some family stories to "flesh things out" be sure to introduce it with a line such as "family legend has it," or "I've been told," or some such so future genealogists will know fact from fiction.

Why don't you do your family history and send it on? It will interest our current readers, but better than that, it will do future generations a service.

Correspondence Made Easy

When I do correspondence I generally seem to do a lot of it. That is, I will have six to ten letters in the mail at the same time and they are generally on a variety of ancestors. For a while I would lose track of what I had written and sometimes a year or two later, that is, after having written a letter, I would remember it and wonder why it had not been answered. Or, I would forget if it had been answered. Beverly Shuler, who is a frequent lecturer on the genealogical circuit, puts a copy all off her letters in the same folder as the ancestor she is working on and all of the answers she receives. That way she knows just what she as asked and what has been anwered. That seems like a good solution.

This Correspondence Form, allows you to refine that good method. Make a copy of it and staple it to the inside back cover of your ancestor folder and you will know at a glance when you wrote a letter, to whom it went and if they answered.

I noticed on my correspondence log just last month that two people haven't answered a letter of over a year ago. Now I'm going to try again. I would probably have forgotten if I hadn't looked at the Log.



Census Material Available In Charlotte

If you have worked the S.C. Archives you know they have the Federal Census for South Carolina only. If you want to look for an ancestor in Georgia you can't do it there. When I found that the Public Library on Tryon (their main street) in Charlotte had lots of Federal Census for most states I was very pleased. Its easier to get to Charlotte than Richmond or Atlanta and certainly a lot easier than going to Alabama or Texas.

Then the Library in Charlotte was closed for three years for remodeling. (Parts of it were kept open, but the genealogy section was small and unsatisfactory.) During that period I used the Latter Day Saints Library, but there one has to order the roll of microfilm and wait for its arrival. Plus it cost a few dollars.

But the Library in Charlotte has been open for over a year now and a beautiful library it is with a large new genealogical section where at least one person is always on duty to help one find what one needs. As you can see from the two charts starting on the next page, Charlotte has most of the Census records from most states, plus lots more information on microfilm. This chart was copied form another Newsletter so it is a bit "skewed" (probably from a copier) but it is still very readable. If you are looking for an out-of-state census, Charlotte is probably the place to look.

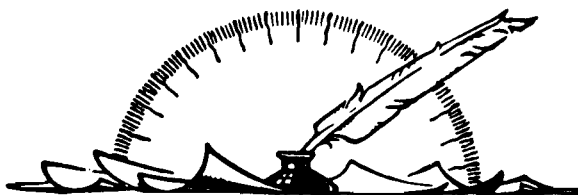

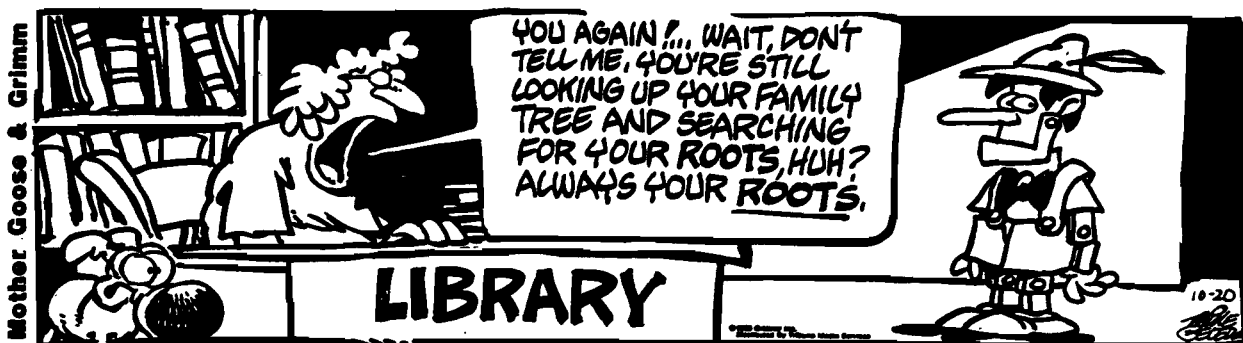

The family was listed in the 1850 Census for Fairfield county, S.C. According to census record all were born in S.C. Martha was my great-grandmother, who at some time moved to Mississippi and married Thomas Edwin Hewitt on 1 Janurary, 1867. Any information on the Montgomery family would be appreciated.

OWEN: Help! Will exchange any information regarding Larkin Owen b. c1779 (NC?) possibly the son of John Owen and Mary "Polly" LARKIN, who was married to Patsy c1800 in Fairfield District, S.C. He died 28 May 1849 at Tippah Co, Mississippi. Deed from James McCullough, Nov. 1806, states Larken Owen is a planter of Fairfield. He is on 1800 census in Fairfield. Who is John Owen of 1790 and 1800 Fairfield Census?

MARTIN and CARTLEDGE: Will exchange any information regarding James and Jane Martin. Immigrated 12 Jan 1768 on the "James and Mary." Received 400 acres on Wateree River in Kershaw Co. as bounty. Children; William (c1755-1828) M. to Sarah ROTTEN; John I. (c1756-1822) who married Nancy CARTLEDGE d/o Dr. Edmund Cartledge; Jane (b. c 1758 and married Benjamine STILL); Andrew (b. c1760 and married Jane ROSENBOROUGH); James b. c 1762 (who served from Fairfield under Capt Edward Martin and Major John Pearson); all born in County Antrim, Ulster, Ireland. Later in Abbeville and Edgefield, S.C then Georgia and Alabama.



How To Figure Dates From Tombstones

Let us say you have found the tombstone of an ancestor, and on that tombstone you find the date of his death and his age at death. You want to determine the date of his birth. He died 16 April 1904.

He was age	1904 (year)	4 (months)	16 (days)
	61 (years)	1 (month)	10 (days)
	1843 (year)	3 (months)	6 (days)

Born 6 March 1843

But, too often it is more complicated than that. He died 16 April 1904.

His age was	1904 (year)	4 (months)	16 (days)
	83 (years)	8 (months)	21 (days)

What you do is borrow 30 days from April for a total of 46 days--and borrow 12 months from 1904 for a total of 15 months, having already borrowed a month. So you get:
