

CURRY, My 3g-grandfather, William CURRY (b. 16 Jan1815 Chester Co, SC MOFFATT d. 10 Dec 1870 Obion Co, TN) md. 1841 Elizabeth MOFFATT (b. 1819 Chester Co, SC.) William moved to Obion Co, TN with his family in a wagon train leaving Chester Co. 24 Oct 1848 & arriving Troy, TN one month later.
