A formula has been devised to detemine the date of birth if the data you have found shows the complete date of death and the deceased age in years, months and days at death. This was copied from the March-April 1992 issue of "Everton's Genealogical Helper."

## SOCIAL SECURITY DEATH INDEX Information found at the Family History Library

The Family History Library (LDS) has acquired the Social Security Death Index. It is available to users of the main library or any Family History Center that offers a compact disc program. The Family History Center at 4440 Jackson Blvd., Columbia, SC is usually closed during the month of August. The hours for research are:

Tues. and Wed. - 9:00 am until 3:00 pm 2nd & 4th Sundays - 2:00 pm until 4:00 pm

The Index lists 39.5 million deceased people who had social security numbers and whose deaths occurred between 1962 and the end of 1988. Upon typing a person's name and an appropriate date of death (if known), the following information will be displayed:

Name of person (alphabetically by surname, then by given name)

Year of birth as reported to Social Security

State that issued the social security number

Year of death

State in which the person resided at the time of death.

An optional selection feature permits you to obtain more information on a specific person, such as:

Full date of birth

Month and year of death

Social security number

State where the death benefit was sent to a living relative. (Zip codes can be obtained for a place of death and where death benefits were sent.)

A zip code directory will incorporated in the system list name of the communities serviced by the zip code.

Knowing the date and place of death enables you to obtain a death certificate. By sending a copy of the death certificate, social security number, and form SSA 1-1977, "Social Security Number Record, Third Party Request for Extract or Photocopy" (available through any Social Security Office) and \$7.00 you may secure a photocopy of the original social security application. The application will show the address of the applicant, date and place of birth, father's name and mother's maiden name. Address your inquiry to Social Security Administration, 4 H 8 Annex, 6401 Security Blvd., Baltimore MD 21235.

#### CONFEDERATE BAPTIST

This listing was in the papers when I became editor. If anyone knows where this church is located, please let me know. Gloria

Issue of October 22, 1862

Died, on Sunday, October 5th, Sallie McMeekin, third daughter of John R. and Mary Ann Shirley, aged 6 years and 7 months...

Issue of October 29, 1862

Departed this life, October 19, in Fairfield district, Miss Elizabeth Broom, daughter of Mr. Charles Broom, aged 36...

Issue of November 4, 1862

John W. Banks fell at the battle of Sharpsburg, Md., 17th of September, 1862 on his birthday, aged just 21...member of the Buckhead Guards...eldest son of Dorcas and the late Samuel Banks, Esq., of Little River, Fairfield district.

Issue of November 12, 1862

Died, in Winnsboro, S.C., October 29, 1862, Mary Ida, infant daughter of Drucilla and Thomas A. Steel, aged 2 months and 15 days.

Issue of February 19, 1863

Departed this life on Friday, the 9th Jan., Mrs. Mary W. Stokes, consort of deacon J. B. Stokes, aged 37 years, 2 months and 12 days...member of Woodward Baptist Church...

Departed this life on Saturday, the 10th Jan., Mrs. Sarah W. Head, aged 60 years, 11 months and 28 days...(aunt ot the above), member of Woodward Baptist Church...

Issue of March 18, 1863

Died at Roseland, Fairfield district, on the 2d of February, little Fammie Darling, aged 3 years and six months, only daughter of David C. and Elizabeth M. Means...

Died at Shady Grove, Fairfield district, on the 7th of Feb., James B. Mobley, aged 2 years and 4 months, second son of David C. and Elizabeth M. Means.

Died at Shady Grove, Fairfied district, on the 23rd of February, Zebulon Mobley, aged 1 year, infant son of David C. and Elizabeth M. Means.

Issue of Marsh 25, 1863

Died at the residence of her son, in Ninety Six, at half-past 2 o'clock, on the morning of the 7th Feb., 1863, Mrs. Agnes Corley in the 70th year of her age. She was the daughter of William Ferguson, deceased, and was born in Fairfield District, on the 16th March, 1793, and became a member of the Methodist society in Kershaw District, Jan. 11, 1807, and was married to Rev. Robert Corley, 25 June 1815...Baptist Church at Sardis, in Edgefield District...In March, 1829, she was left a widow with four little children.

She saw these two boys buried in baptism...The younger son, Robert, fell in Mexico, on 10th August 1947...(long eulogy.)

Issue of April 15, 1863

Died at Doko, March 22, Lottie Bookhart Durham, third daughter of Rev. A. K. and Mrs. Emma d. Durham, aged 5 months and 3 days...

Issue of May 6, 1863

Died, at Culpeper C.H., Va., in the 24th year of his age, Ephraim Hodgin Fant, youngest child of Rev. Ephraim Fant, deceased...born in Chester District, and lived there until called out to fight for his country...17th Regt., S.C.V...left a wife, and aged mother, two sisters and two brothers...

Issue of May 27, 1863

Died, Feb., 14th, in Virginia, Benjamin Hays, a member of Co. C, 12th Regt... left parents and wife...his younger brother, John Hays, had died also. Doko, S.C.

Issue of August 19th, 1863

Departed this life, July 25th, 1863, at her grand-mother's residence on Dutchman's Creek, Fairfield district, S.C., Fannie Tidwell, only child of Rev. J. S. Tidwell, aged 11 years and 3 months.

Issue of September 2, 1863

Married on the 11th inst., by Rev. W. D. Beverly, H. A. Glenn, Esq., of Fairfield, to Miss Mary Palmer, of Union, S.C.

Issue of September 16, 1863

Died, at his residence in Winnsboro, on the 15th of August, Mr. Osmond Woodward, being within a few days of being sixty-nine years of age...member of the State Legislature, some years ago...

Issue of December 9, 1863

Departed this life in Newberry District, 15 Nov., at 2 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Mary E. Mobley, consort of Dr. J. R. Mobley, and daughter of Col. B. F. Griffin, of Newberry district, having just entered her 36th year...member of Old Bush River church and later Dry Creek Church.

Departed this life at Long Town, on 27th Nov., Mary Altona, youngest daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Lucy R. Boyd, aged 18 months...

FAIRFIELD LORE

Did you know that a public building in Winnsboro was designed by the first Federal Architect of the United States? And that he was appointed by South Carolina's only President?

Answer: The Fairfield County Court House was designed by Robert Mills, a Charleston native who received much of his training while he was associated with Thomas Jefferson at Monticello, near Charlottesville, Va. Mills was appointed Federal Architect by President Andrew Jackson. Ainsley Hall Mansion, one of Columbia's tourist attractions, was designed by Robert Mills. In the center of the nation's Capital stands another Mills' structure, the Washington Monument.
