I would be interested in knowing if your Society has any information and/or a family tree of a **Jonathan Belton Mickle** of Fairfield County, who was the father of the **James Rutland Mickle** (1860-Abt 1925) who married **Mary E. Feemster** (1865-Aft 1906). Jonathan Belton Mickle may have married Mary Montgomey, d/o Green B. Montgomery. I know that the Mickle's have lived in Fairfield County since 1790. Please let me know if you have anything. Enclosed is what information I have on this family. Thank you.

Thank you very much for the information that you sent me on the family of Jonathan Belton Mickle of Fairfield County. It was a great help in my research. I have enclosed an updated Mickle family outline which was compiled from family records and the information you sent me plus a brief summary of their lives.

Some of what you sent me suggested that Jonathan Belton Mickle was the son of Joseph Mickle (1720-1784) of Ireland, but that can't be correct since Jonathan Belton Mickle was born in 1819. Instead, Jonathan Belton would have had to be the son of Joseph Mickle, Jr. (1775-1835), the son of Joseph Mickle of Ireland. I came to this conclusion for three reasons. The first reason is that Jonathan Belton's father is listed as a Joseph Mickle, the second is that Joseph Mickle, Jr.'s family was born around this period of time (1819), and third, the mother of this family was Martha BELTON.

In your letter to me, you mentioned some wills. Are there any Mickle wills available? Also, are any of the Mickle properties still standing and/or are there any photos of paintings of the Mickles? I would be greatly interested in any of these.

Mickle Family Summary

Joseph Mickle (1720-1784) was born in Ireland and with his wife, Miss Hyde, came to America in the 1750's and settled, with a Quaker colony, near Camden, SC with a royal land grant. Their children included John, Jonathan, Joseph, Jr., Thomas, Robert, Rebecca and Sarah. Major Joseph Mickle was a patriot and soldier in the American Revolution. Two of his sons, Major Joseph Mickle, Jr. and Captain John Mickle served in the the War of 1812.

One of these sons, Major Joseph Mickle, Jr. (1775-1835), married Martha Belton, daughter of John Belton and Mary English. The Belton and English families, were also part of the Quaker colony that had settled near Camden. During the Revolution, these two families remained loyal to the crown and in fact sided with England. After the Revolution, their properties were confiscated and they were exiled to Florida but later returned.

Joseph, Jr. and Martha Belton had a large family and one of their younger sons was Jonathan Belton Mickle (1819-1892). Jonathan Belton, a lawyer, first married Sarah Montgomery and they had one daughter. They, like many of the Mickles, lived in Fairfield County. Later, he married Ann Ellen Graham (1829-1889). He was a Officer in the Confederate Army and served in Charleston during the Civil War.

After the war he became a Methodist minister. Rev. Mickle did mission work in Virginia and Tennessee and returned to South Carolina in 1873, where he raised a large family in York County.

One of Jonathan Belton Mickle's sons, James Rutland Mickle (1860-1929), a house carpenter, married Mary Feemster (1865-1943), and raised his family in York County.

The oldest son of James Rutland Mickle was Samuel Russell Mickle (1884-1918). He married Gertrude Mayhew of Virginia. When he got a job with the railroad, they moved to Charlotte, North Carolina. He died of pneumonia at the age of 36 and left three children, Samuel Russell, Kathryn Gertrude and Harry Lee (Buck).

Samuel Russell Mickle, born in 1914, attended UNC and married Polly Lohr. He worked in the insurance industry until his recent retirement. They have two children and four grandchildren.

Kathryn married Dennis Gray, who is now retired from the trucking industry. They have one daughter and three grandsons.


Buck, the youngest, was born in 1918. He died in Europe during World War II.

Joseph BROWN and Mary (STEVENSON) BROWN had a son named Joseph BROWN, born 20 Nov. 1803, died 1859. The son married Jane Waldrop in Alabama. The son of Joseph Brown and Jane (Waldrop) BROWN was James [Martin/Marion?] BROWN 1831-1918. His first wife was Lydia Laura Lansdale, second wife was Matilda Cole Ray, third wife was Mildred Kelly.

100 Years Ago

The News and Herald, Weekly Edition, Winnsboro, S.C., Wednesday, January 28, 1880

At a recent meeting of the members of the congregation of Hopewell Associate Reformed Church it was agreed that the pastor, Rev. John A. White, should devote half of his time to White Oak Church in this county.

The new Methodist Church at Blackstock will be dedicated, services, on the first Sunday in February. The Rev. A.M. Chreitzberg, Presiding Elder of the District, will preach the sermon on the occasion. The Trustees of the church extend a cordial invitation to Christians of all denominations to worship with the congregation on that day.

Louise Pomerov.

The favorable notices given by the newspapers of Miss Louise Pomeroy's performances naturally caused people here to expect something far above the ordinary. This expectation was more than realized. Miss Pomeroy, is herself an actress of great merit, and she is well supported. The play, "The Adirondacks," was given before a crowded house on Friday night, and the universal opinion was that it was the finest performance ever seen in Winnsboro. Miss Pomeroy showed her powers in full effect, and her support was remarkably good. There was plenty of fine acting, and none poor ... On Saturday night Shakespeare's comedy, "As You Like It," was admirably rendered and duly appreciated. The Company left on Sunday for Columbia, where they will fill an engagement for three nights. We trust that when they make another Southern tour they will not forget Winnsboro.

The Monticello Graded School has opened with over sixty scholars. Col. H.C. Davis is principal and Mrs. Benjamin Scott has been elected assistant. The people of Monticello deserve credit for their enterprise, and we trust the school may be of much benefit.

Lost on the evening of the 24th between Thespian Hall and the Brown's Hotel a cross set with brilliants. A suitable reward will be given if returned A.W. Brown.

We are pleased to see in Winnsboro our young friend, Mr. Sol Wolfe. Mr. Wolfe went to Texas in 1878, but preferring a field not so far away from home, returned east and went into business in New York. He is now connected with a large jewelry establishment in that city. His life as a "commercial tourist" seems to agree with him. We hope he will find his stay in the 'Boro very pleasant.
