Aids in Locating an Unknown Maiden Name

From Colonial time until the 1960's, deeds in South Carolina given by married couples, required a renouncement of the wife's, "dower's rights." This can be found at the end of the deed with signatures and witnesses usually in the lower left hand corner. Under the law at that time, this was done to protect the wife's dower right. Many times, this can serve as a source for a female's maiden name. Today, dower's right do not have to be renounced in South Carolina.

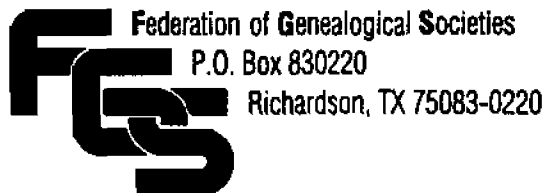

Dallas is a city of contrasts: soaring skyscrapers, neon lights, cosmopolitan urban centers, a little bit of country, a touch of western, a dash of Dixie, and a smidgen of south of the border.

Research Opportunities

■ **Question:** What is the one thing that can make a good genealogical conference even better? The answer is an opportunity to combine a conference with research.

Dallas County, Tarrant County (Ft. Worth), and North-Central Texas are home to dozens of repositories with exceptional genealogical and historical collections. Listed below are just a few of the major libraries and archives. Don't overlook the smaller local collections that may have that one record identifying your ancestor.

■ **The Dallas Public Library** (1515 Young Street, Dallas, TX 75201), owns one of the major top-ten genealogical collections in the United States. In the Genealogy Section on the 8th floor (214-670-1433) and Texas/Dallas Special Collections on the 7th floor (214-670-1435), you will find the largest collection of genealogical and historical materials in the South. Located blocks from the conference site at the corners of Young, Ervay, and Wood Streets, the DPL is conveniently open 7 days a week:

Monday-Thursday, 9 AM-9 PM

Friday-Saturday, 9 AM-5 PM

Sunday, 1 PM-5 PM (closed Labor Day)

■ **National Archives-Fort Worth, Southwest Regional Branch.** (PO Box 6216, Ft. Worth, TX 76115; 817-334-5525), houses federal records and materials for the states of Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas, including many Indian records concerning the Five Civilized Tribes Agency. Located at 501 W. Felix at Hemphill, the archives is open Monday-Friday, 8 AM-4 PM (closed Labor Day).

■ **Southern Methodist University**, (SMU Post Office, Dallas, TX 75275), located minutes from the central downtown business district at Hillcrest between Daniel and Mockingbird Lane, has several campus libraries, including the Bridwell Theology Library, the major Texas repository for Methodist records, and the DeGolyer Library housing a respected Texana Collection.

■ **Dallas Historical Society Library**, (PO Box 26038, Dallas, TX 75226; 214-421-4500), located in the beautiful Fair Park Hall of State, is home to one of the largest collections of historical materials on Dallas County. Research in the library is by appointment and a small fee is charged.

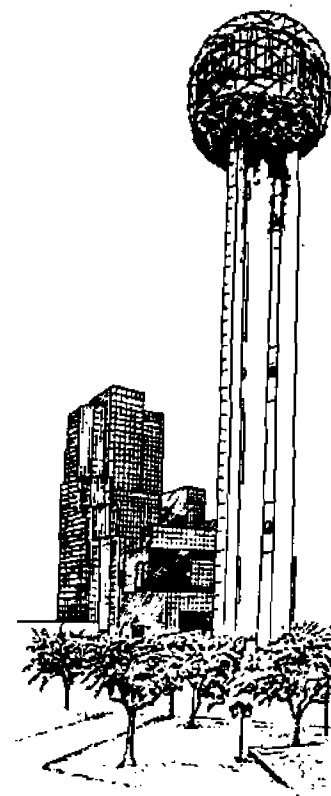
• Information on commercial shuttle services to the hotel from D/FW Airport or Love Field will be included in your confirmation packet.

Accommodations

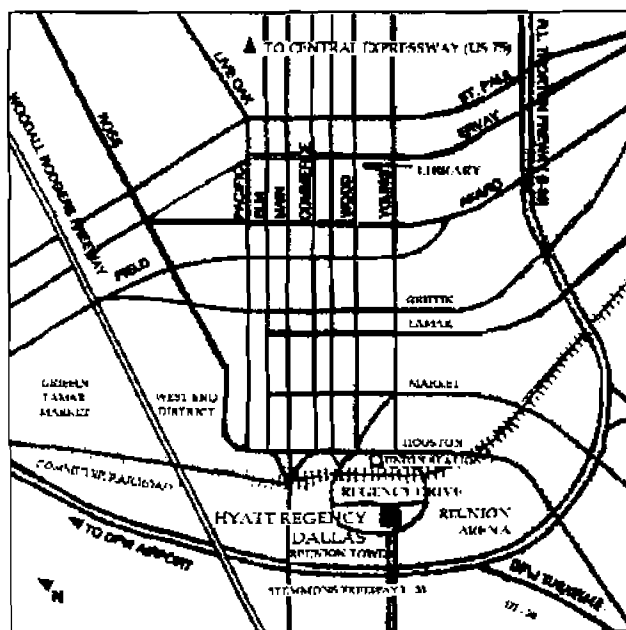
Cancellation Policy

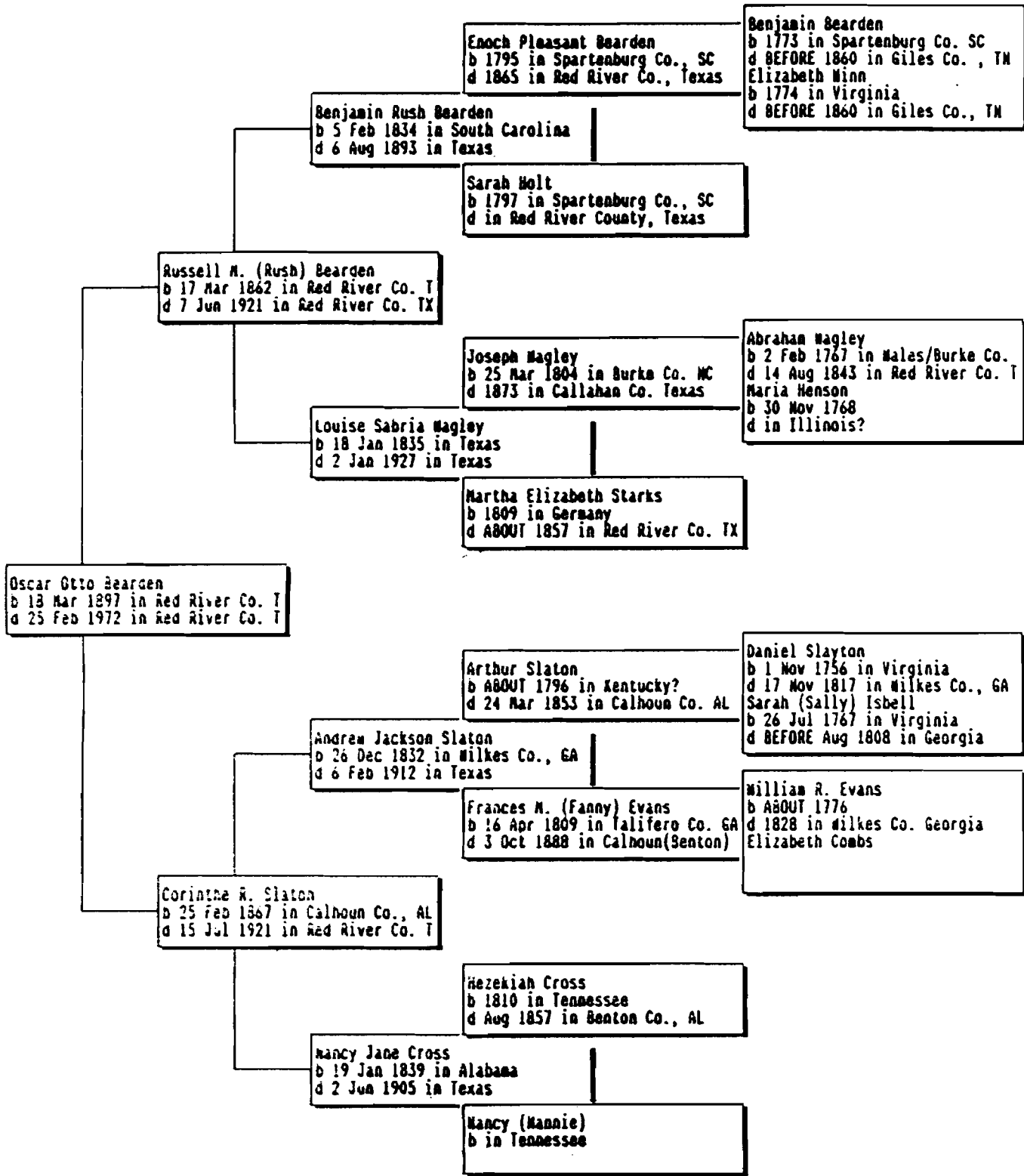

Minor Winn

1708-1778

Beginning with the first of the name of authentic record in Virginia known to the compiler, A. Evans Wynn of SOUTHERN LINEAGES, RECORDS OF THIRTEEN FAMILIES, published in 1940, beginning page 353.

Minor Winn , of Caroline County appears in 1733 and 1734. Not many of the old records of that county survive, but in the few that do there is mention of him.

It is ordered that James Adkins pay Minor Winn 30 pounds of tobacco for one days attendance, at court for Caroline County April, 12, 1733. Caroline records also show that the Will of Richard Winn dated 9 December 1748 was presented by Benjamin Winn Executor. Many of the same names used in the following families were used in this one too, but it is not known where they fit.

On the 25th June 1737 between Francis Thornton, Gentleman of St. Marie's Parish in Caroline County and Minor Winn of Parish of St. Margarets in same county, Minor paid 5 shilling for 202 acres of land in the fork of Rappahannock River on Potator Run.(This land in Orange county, Virginia)

Minor was later known as " Minor Winn of Fauquier County".

Col. Richard Henry Lee leased to Minor, John Winn and wife Dorothy, a farm of 220 acres in Fauquier Co. detailing what was to be done. Minor Winn and his son John also were granted to keep an Ordinary at the courthouse, executed bond according to law. September 1763 Fauquier County.

Minor Winn and Margaret his wife of Leed's Parish, Fauquier deed to James Winn.... 26 April 1772

Minor Winn made his will July 1, 1775 where it is recorded in Will Book 1 page 343. It is probated on 5 July 1778. He mentions wife Margaret, sons Minor, Richard, William , James , and John; daughters Margaret Johnson, Mary Smith, Elizabeth, Susannah Grant and granddaughter Martha Ann Winn.

Minor got his father's Great Bible,

Instrument added to Will: Purchased land of Martin Pickett on S. side of South River, right in this land to son Minor..whereas I had a partnership with son and we erected a still house on the said land and furnished same with necessary utensils for carrying on distilling business, profits to be divided between Margaret (wife) and Minor (son) to keep 1/2 what they shall be appraised. 5 July 1778

A positive asseration made by the descendants that Lettice Winn who married John Bearden was the sister of General Richard Winn, therefore the daughter of Minor Winn, Sr. of Fauquier County is not yet verified. There are many clues which prove kinship and origin in the same locality

are strong. Lettice Bearden was a Winn before her marriage. Miss Minnie Smith of Glenn Springs S.C. deceased by 1940, had several letters which she felt proved that Lettice was a daughter of Minor, Sr.Your letters received, and I assure you it will give me pleasure to reply to your questions, My grandmother was Mourning Bearden, dau. of John and Lettice. Lettice Gowen was my grandmothers sister. My Grandmother was annoyed by the Tories, in her husband's absence that she had to leave home and live with her sister Lettice Gowen during the later years of the war.

The Bearden's were Loyalist and bitter enemies of my father; therefore all intercourse between Smith's and Beardens ceased for a long time. My father said the Winns and Bearden's all came to S.C. together.

...In another letter
To the younger members of the Winn family the Bearden's were not known, possibly for the reason they were Tories. Two of the Beardens, Richard and William were members of my Grandfather's Company.***

I am quite positive of my great grandmother being a sister of Gen. Richard Winn for I have heard all my many older relatives say repeatedly that she was.

*** in the Pinckney District Quarterly though there was a listing of British Regiment Commanded by Col. Benjamin Roebuck in which John, Winn, and Drury Bearden were members.

Richard Winn, General

1737-1818

Winnsboro, in Fairfield county, South Carolina was named for General Richard and his brother Col. John Winn. The write up I have about this was taken from the History of Fairfield County which was several write ups in newspapers in early 1900's.

Col John Winn was a high toned, honorable man, and owned most of the land around Winnsboro and lived at the south end of town where Dr. Hanahan now lives.

General Richard held the rank of Colonel in the Revolution. He was a true patriot, and perhaps fought as many battles in the war and with as firm a heart as any man living or dead. He filled a seat in Congress of the United States for many years.

General Richard's family was not considered very smart. Mrs. Winn's maiden name was Blocker (?) and Edgefield family. One of their daughters caused some merriment among her young lady acquaintances, who ask where she got a fine shell comb she was wearing, by replying that "her father bought it in Congress".

Mills in his statistics of South Carolina, in writing of eminent men of Fairfield, says "General Richard Winn was also a native of Virginia" At the beginning of the Revolutionary struggle, he entered into the regular service of this state. Having acquitted glory in the battle of Fort Moultrie, he was sent to the Georgia frontier, and commanded a company at Fort St. Illa. The service was a most perilous one and he was selected for it on account of his superior merit as an officer. Shortly after his arrival at the fort, he was attacked by a strong body of Tories and Indians. These he beat off for two succeeding days; on the third, he surrendered with honorable terms to Major General Prevost, at the head of a considerable regular force.

General Winn returned to Fairfield after his defeat, if it can properly be called one, and to his command of a regiment of refugee militia. He was in several battles and the success of the affairs of Hook's defeat in York, and the Hanging Rock in Lancaster, greatly depended on his heroic exertions.

He was wounded and borne off the field about the time the enemy effected his retreat. On his recovery General Winn continued to afford General Sumpter his able support and ceased not to serve his country whilst a red coat could be found in Carolina. He was a true patriot, and perhaps fought as many battles as any man living or dead.

General Winn moved to Ducktown, Tennessee in 1812 and died a short while after.

Col. John Winn and his family moved to Georgia.

John Bearden

1744-1836

Served in the Revolutionary War in the South Carolina line of Rangers or spies, from Spartenburg District when he enlisted in April 1777 and on his pension application said he was 33 at the time. In August of 1778 he stated he lived in Union District. Many time the enlistment was only for 3 months. He served at least one more term in service. Once under Capt. John Gowen and once under Capt. Blassingame. The date of his deposition for the pension was 15 May 1833, in Bedford County, Tennessee..

In the records of Friendship Baptist Church in Pauline, South Carolina 1802 gives the John Bearden family as members, also Richard Bearden family, and individuals listed were Isaac Bearden, Benjamin and Elizabeth Bearden and in 1803 Mary Bearden, John Bearden Jr. and Lettice Bearden were received.

On October 30, 1802 Rhody Moore is baptised but shown in 1818 Rhoda Moore , Averilla Moore and Hannah Moore, and Anna Moore. Averilla and Rhody are later wives of some the Beardens.

Also included are some names not able to place in a family, Rachel Bearden, Delilah Bearden, Sarah Bearden and in 1832 Mitchell Bearden.

This church later became the Baptist Church of Bethel in Woodruff, S.C.

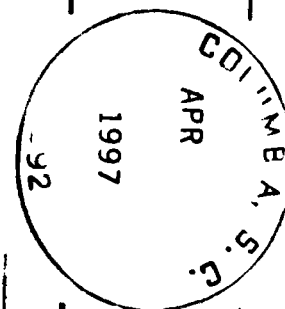
