Thomas Lewis Young in the 1880 Census was in Camden, DeKalb Tws., Kershaw County, age 27, married to Rebecca E. McDonald or McDowell.

They had 2 children:

1. Charles A. Young, age 3
2. Adam L. Young, age 4 1/2

T.L. Young's death record says that his father's name was David.

Rebecca E. McDonald Young's death record says that she had two sisters, Mrs. C.B. or C.S. Nettles of Camden and Mrs. M.D. Lyles of Jonesville, S.C. The 1880 census states that she was born 1845. She died 1927 in Spartanburg County.

The Young family came to Campobello, S.C., and joined the First Baptist Church in 1889, by letter, and then moved to Spartanburg County and joined the Bethlehem Baptist Church, May 16, 1891. They farmed and lived in Spartanburg County the rest of their lives. They are buried in the Church Cemetery, as most of their families.

The Church records of the Campobella Baptist Church burned and we do not know which Baptist Church they came from in the Camden area.

Rebecca McDonald used to tell about her family hiding the cow in the woods, the food in the well and burying the silverware to keep Sherman's army from taking it.

We appreciate any information any one can give us on the above family and will pay costs of copying and postage.

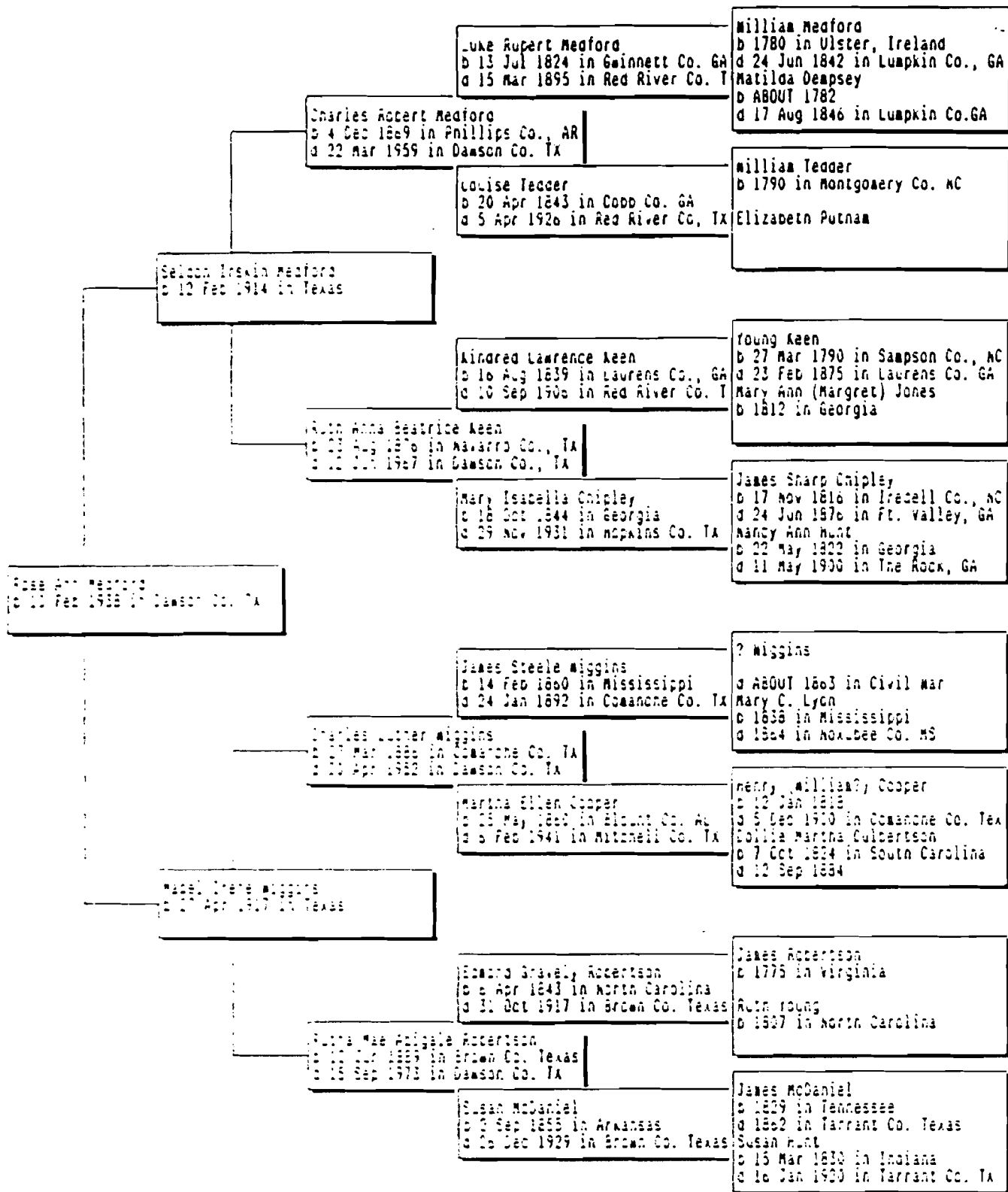
There are 2 distinct handwritings here. The Bible was not bought until 1807 and maybe not until Sarah (Sally) Coats and James Lewis were married in June 1809, but in a Land Deed in Fairfield County, South Carolina in 1819 and 1820, Sarah in one and Salley in the other, made her mark, but James Lewis could write, so I am assuming it is his hand which wote the first part. The latter handwriting must be Catherine's, his last wife.

Note also that two of the known children of James Lewis mentioned in his will of 1842, Martha and George W. Lewis are not listed here. It is believed there was another wife Martha Evaline Flemming, married August 1827, and these are her two children. It is not known why this marriage and the children would not be listed.

None of the marriages for James children are listed, although half were married by time of his death.

James Alexander Watson died and Administration Bond was made by Ann Watson, William Lewis, James Craig, Jesse Hovis, and George Lott. This dated (day not readable) October 1797. Ann Watson and William Lewis granted Letters of Administration. On 31st Oct. 1797 appraisers listed the goods and chattels as 458-14-10 1/10. Another document dated 4 September 1797 says Ann Watson and Jonathan Belton were granted Letters of Admr.

On the 1810 Fairfield County census page 197 a James Lewis is listed with 1 male under 5 (Charles Alexander) , 1 male 26-45 (himself- age29) and 1 female 16-25 (Sarah age 17) and 3 slaves. Next house is Ann Watson, herself and another female over 45, 1 male age 10-16 and 2 males 16-26, and 23 slaves.

After James Alexander Watson died Ann _____ Watson married William Robertson of Fairfield County. She was his 3rd wife. Deed Book U-12 has their marriage agreement dated 18 December 1810. They were not married yet, but were married soon after.

Basically his property at marriage to his heirs and hers to her heirs.

Recorded April 11 1811 pages 12,13 of Record Book 1811-1812

In Ann _____ Watson Robertson's will dated 17 September 1813 and proved 9 November 1813, In will Book #6 page 196 Apt. #29 File # 445, Her son John Watson was Executor. Heirs mentioned, all sons: Ephriam Watson, William Alexander Watson, John Watson, James Watson, Richardson Walker Watson, Hardy Davis Watson. She only names 8 slaves in her will.

There is a John and William Watson on the 1800 census.

In a paper from family researcher the following information is presented.
May 1774 Alex Watson age 35 from Strathspey bound for New York on George of Port Greenock.

William Alexander Watson married Elizabeth born about 1778-80 died 19 June 1857 Lowndes County Ms. buried Bevill Hill Cemetery. Will date for Wm. Alex. 26 September 1823 Book 11 page 125. children : Nancy, Jane, Ruthy, Charlotte, Elizabeth, Walker. These were later in Winston and Lowndes Co. Ms. and Greene, Sumpter and Tuscaloosa County Alabama. William was probably born about 1782. He died in Fairfield County, S.C. and his wife Elizabeth went to Al. and Ms. with her children. The 1820 census of S.C. shows these 5 daughters and 1 son.

William and John were the oldest (probably John) and both were listed on the 1800 census. Ephriam was next and was listed on 1810, but not on the 1820 S.C. census. He has died, is missed or moved out of state.

Ann Watson (continued)

One John Watson died in Fairfield Co. and his will is recorded in Volume 1 (1787-1819) section 6 page 52, but this is probably the brother of James Alexander, not his son.

One source says Harley and one Hardy (Davis) for another son, a Hardway is listed on Fairfield Co. census in 1820 showing 2 sons and 2 daughters.

Richard Walker Watson was born about 1793 and died 1 September 1860 at his home in Fairfield County, South Carolina at age 67. he married Harriett Spann and they have several daughters and 1 son. A Richard is listed in 1820 census of Abbeville Co. but shows 2 sons and 2 daughters.

There is another son James, which is the youngest, I assume, about which nothing is known at present.

Am now checking James Alexander Watson 1790 census and Ann Watson 1800 to see if she did not have daughters. (March 1, 1994)

To my son George W. Lewis three negroes given him some time since but not delivered, by name Mase, Marcus and Noel and it is my further will that he shall have at my death three other negroes name Charles, Abram and Sally.

To my son Wesley Lewis three negroes by name Lock, Shelby and March.

To my son Thomas Lewis, two negro boys by name Anderson and Henry and a girl Jude.

To my daughter Mary Weatherford I bequeath the amount of certain notes, drawn by her husband William Weatherford and myself in favor of James Duncan for one thousand five hundred dollars, of which two hundred dollars have been paid.

To my daughter Manerva Lyon I have given nine hundred dollars and it is my will that at my death she shall receive the sum of six hundred dollars from my executor to be collected as hereinafter directed.

To my daughter Sarah Hudson I have given three cows and a mare and it is my will that she receive at my death the further bequest of one dollar.

To my daughter Martha Lewis, I bequeath the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars.

To my daughter Margaret Lewis I bequeath the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars.

To my daughter Lavinia Lewis I bequeath the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars.

It is my desire and I do hereby enjoin it upon my executor that all of the remaining negroes which have not been herein bequeathed shall be kept

From Orphans Court Minutes Book 5, 1850-1854

Several entries as to money paid out (but no listing as to whom) pp 516 November 8, 1852 William Weatherford in right of his wife, Mary Weatherford, vs James C. Spencer, admr. of James Lewis who died in September 1842. Weatherford states that Lewis had around 30 slaves which are hired out, and a large real estate holdings. This was filed in Court on August 19, 1852.

*Note: These 30 slaves mentioned are besides the ones named in the will. The land mentioned is located near the present town of Moundville near the middle of county and top edge of present day Hale County.

Catherine is listed as wife in will— on 1830 census oldest female is 20-30. Minerva's age from the 1850-1860 census would be about this, or this is Catherine. Either way she couldn't be mother to most of the children. (unless census taker missed writing her age?) Found 1850 census of Catherine Lewis in 1850 Neshoba County, Mississippi and she is 35 years old, being born in 1815. Surely she did not marry till past 1830, so only last four children are hers.

Evidently all the land owned by James Lewis was sold,except for the bequest to Andrew J. Lewis, at the time of final settlement to pay out distributions. Negroes given to sons and money to daughters, is all that's noted except these final amounts.

*Minerva is listed on the 1860 census of Noxubee County, Mississippi as Mrs. M. Lyon and at some time her children by Mizzell were known as Lyon other than this census.

Records received July 20 1993 from a descendants spouse Cathron Davis, are from JOHN SKELTON OF GEORGIA by Retired Colonel John Skelton of Virginia and from THE NEVILL FAMILY by Ivan B. Nevill of Houston Tx. Also from family records of Mrs. John Clay Lewis, Mrs. Evelyn Lewis Robinson, and various county records in the county mentioned, also state census.

Received in Feb. 1994 from another descendant, Charles Germany who had additional information from the family Bible which had belonged to Mrs. Pam McWilliams of Winnsboro, La. who is now deceased since she sent him records in 1989.

There is a record of marriage of a James Lewis to Nancy Thralkill in Bibb County, Alabama 11 May 1826. There is a gap of 4 years between last child of James and Sarah till he married Martha E. Flemming in 1828, so it is possible this could be another wife. Evidently there were no children by her, as none listed in family Bible. Neither is the marriage of Martha Ervaline Flemming and the birth of her two children, Martha and George Wright Lewis, but these two are mentioned in James Lewis will.

The Fairfield County Museum

Winnsboro, South Carolina

The building of the Fairfield County Museum was constructed about 1830. It is of Federalist Architecture and was chosen by Richard Cathcart where he built his home. It is one of eight buildings of this type remaining in the United States today.

George Ladd and his wife Catherine acquired the building in 1852. They opened the Winnsboro Female Institute for young ladies and about 100 young ladies from all over the State attended. It was forced to close during the War Between the States and the Ladds moved to Feasterville Boarding House in Western Fairfield County.

In the early 1920s, it was used for the students of Mount Zion Institute, when Mount Zion burned and was being remolded.

Later it became a boarding house and was made into apartments for a while and for many years a restaurant was on the first floor.

In 1969 it was selected for restoration as one of South Carolina's Tricentennial gifts to the people of South Carolina.

The Historical Commission, under the leadership of Mr. William Rank Patrick restored the building. The Cathcart family gave the building to the Historical Commission of Fairfield County for a Museum. On March 15th, 1976, the doors were opened to the Fairfield County Museum.

On entering the front door, one finds a wide hall way extending the length of the building, with two rooms on each side. A stairway ascends to the second story and on to the top floor. There is also a basement that houses rest rooms and storage units. All of the floors are of the same plan. wide hallway and two rooms on each side.

A committee headed by Mrs. Robert (Caroline Arnette) Erice, was formed to furnish the rooms. It was decided to use the lower floor as it has been used in the beginning. A living room and dining room were furnished with pieces donated by Prescilla Kethcin Norris and the Doty family along with other pieces donated by interested families.

The Museum collection, which had been stored at Mount Zion Institute in Winnsboro, was moved to the second floor.

On the third floor are two bed rooms.

Besides these furnituring, there are collections of Indian artifacts, cooking and farming implements of the 1800s: clothing of early days, dolls, books, engravings, quilts, clocks. Also an outstanding Chinese exhibit donated by Miss Charlotte Dunlap, missionary from Zion Presbyterian Church in Winnsboro, to China for many years.

Geneology is an important museum activity, of which Mrs. Marion (Ruth) Stevenson, member of the John Eratton Chapter #929, of Winnsboro, is a part. The Geneology room is located on the second floor. It contains the Daughters of the American Revolution and United Daughters of Confederacy cabinets, which are filled, with material about Fairfield people. Also, in the room are portraits of Robert E. Lee and Stonewall Jackson. There are several old maps of Fairfield and Mills Atlas. Old books and records from the court house were saved before the fire at old Mount Zion Institute and these creat quite a lot of interest.

There are many copies of the United Daughters of Confederacy Magazines. There are ten volumes of Photographic History of the Civil War: ten volumes of History of World War II: seven volumes on Source records for this war and two volumes of Jefferson Davis Memoir by his wife and one volume of Memoirs of Robert E. Lee. There is a volume on the Defense of Charleston Harbor and 10 volumes on Messages and apers of our early Presidents.

There are seventeen volumes of Southern Literature and a complete list of The Interpersters Bible, and much, much more. There are quite a few old News and Heralds-the local newspaper.

We have the flag of Fay Allen Desportes that draped his coffin. Mr. Desportes was an United States Ambossodor to South America. There is also a personal letter from General Wade Hampton to Mr. Thomas Woodward of winnstoro dated 1892. There is also a book of land grants in Fairfield, Newberry, Union and Laurens County. The work in the Genealogy Department has increased over the years, with letters and visitors from all over the United States of America. This work is very rewarding and the volunteers feel that since the Bible gives the Genealogy back to Adam, God is pleased with this search of ones roots.

This gives you a glimpse of what the Museum is all about. You are encourage to come visit the Fairfield County Museum in Winnstoro, South Carolina.
