## LEVI SMITH

Does anyone have knowledge of the family of one LEVI SMITH, who narrowly escaped being hanged as a Tory during the Revolutionary War in South Carolina? According to early family letters, he was a brother to my g-g-g- grandfather JOHN SMITH of the upper Richland/lower Fairfield area. Tracing this JOHN SMITH has proved a fruitless endeavor. Perhaps pursuing LEVI may be more productive. Loyalists of the American Revolution says of LEVI "Of South Carolina. A native of America. At beginning of the Revolution, Levi was living in the Camden District of South Carolina, where he was a planter and kept a store. He had 850 acres, 120 cultivated. He served as a guide for the British army, and on May 8, 1781, he was taken prisoner, possibly for giving intelligence information to Lord Rawdon. He was about to be hanged, according to Colonel Nisbet Balfour, but was rescued while his would be executors were waiting for a rope. LEVI went to Charleston, then moved to East Florida at the evacuation of Charleston in 1782, and in 1788 returned to Savannah; later, he sailed for England, "but he intended to go eventually to New Providence," according to the British records. SMITH estimated his loss at 3,550 sterling (British pounds), and received 1,358 sterling (BP). Will gladly reimburse postage and copying costs for information on this SMITH family.

## THE JOHNSTONS

The Johnston family that settled in Cherokee County, TX, in the late 1870's, appears to have originally come from Fairfield District, South Carolina.

The progenitor of the family was William Johnston, born about 1750 to 1760. A young man at the time of the Revolution, he probably served in that historic war. He may have been in Fairfield District as early as 1790 when that area was then called "Camden District, Fairfield". His wife's name is currently unknown. William Johnston was a planter but not a large slave owner. His family included two sons, David and Stephen R. Johnston (Sr.) and four daughters, Nelly Johnston, Rachel Johnston, Rebecca Johnston Swan, and Lucretia Johnston Grimes. Rebecca married Benjamin Swan and Lucretia ("Creesay") married Charles Grimes. Nelly may have been married to a Cortney or Courtney. William Johnston lived in the Winnsboro area of Fairfield District and died about 1841 or 1842. He left a will stipulating his property was to go to daughter Nelly, and that there is a family burial plot in the area that should not be sold. The exact location of this family burial ground has not yet been found.

William Johnston's son, Stephen R. Johnston<sup>57</sup>, was born about 1802 in Fairfield District. He, too, became a planter. His wife's name was Mary Griffin. She was the daughter of Eli and Rachel Griffin, who originally had been living in Edgefield District near the western state line of South Carolina and Georgia. Eli Griffin died before 1830. His wife, Rachel Griffin lived another ten years or so, dying about 1842 and leaving a will indicating that the land on which Stephen R. Johnston (Sr.) and her daughter, Mary Johnston, were living, was willed to them by her. At that time, Stephen R. Johnston, Sr., and wife had only one middle aged female slave to serve them, so it is apparent that neither Stephen or his father, William, had been large plantation or slave owners.

Stephen (Sr.) and Mary Griffin Johnston had three surviving sons. The eldest was Eli, born about 1827; James born about 1829-1831, and Stephen R. Johnston, born 1833. The mother, Mary Johnston, died before 1850, leaving Stephen Johnston (Sr.) a widower with three sons nearing adulthood. Not much more is known about Stephen Johnston, Senior, as he followed his wife in death not many years later. By 1860, it is believed that he died. His youngest son, Stephen R. Johnston (Jr.) appears to be settling his estate in this year. The estate, possibly partially inherited from his wife's mother, Rachel Griffin, amounted to \$30,000 in 1860. It is not yet known if Stephen R. Johnston, Jr., was able to acquire all of this amount before the outbreak of the Civil War.

The younger Stephen R. Johnston<sup>57</sup> is the person with whom we are more familiar. By 1857, he had migrated to the county of Union in the state of Arkansas, possibly with his older brother, Eli. The location of the other brother, James Johnston, is not known at this time. At any event, Stephen R. Johnston married Miss Sarah A. P. Darden in the home of her parents in December, 1857. Sarah Darden's parents were George W. and Margaret (Durrett) Darden, who had been living in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The Darden family was of English origin. The progenitor of the Dardens may have been 1 of 3 brothers who left the English shores for Virginia in the late 1600's. The Durrett's may have been French; Margaret Durrett's father, Thomas, was born, however, in 1792/3 in South Carolina. Thomas



Durrett married Rebecca Alewine and as a young man lived in Newberry County, South Carolina, before relocating to Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The elder Durrett lived to be over 90 years old, having moved once again to join the Darden family in Arkansas and possibly following them later to Cherokee County, Texas.

Stephen R. Johnston's wife, Sarah Darden, also came from an old, established Southern family. Sarah Ann Patricia Darden was born in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, in 1842. There is a possibility that one of her father's ancestors may have been a distant cousin, several times removed, to General George Washington. Through her grandfather's line, that of Thomas Durrett's, there is also the possibility that the family was related to General Joseph L. Hogg, who served in the Confederate forces in the War between the States. Unfortunately, the General, assigned to Corinth after the battle of Shiloh, died of dysentery in 1862 before he could establish a distinguished war record. He had, however, served in the Mexican War, was elected to the eighth congress of the Texas Republic and was elected to the state senate from Cherokee County, TX, before the Civil War began. General Hogg, born in Georgia in 1806, moved as a child to Tuscaloosa, Alabama, with his parents, and then to Texas in 1839.

Sarah Darden Johnston had three brothers, William, Lemuel Thomas, and Reuben W. Darden, and three sisters. Of these three brothers, William and Reuben also migrated to Cherokee County after the Civil War. William and Reuben served in the 19th Arkansas Infantry in that conflict. Sarah's mother, Margaret Durrett Darden, also lived to an old age, moving to Cherokee County later in the century to live with her two married daughters. Both married daughters lived in the Rusk area. It is presumed Margaret Darden died in Cherokee County and is buried there.

Stephen and Sarah Johnston had nine children, only seven of whom survived childhood. It is believed two of the children died and were buried in Arkansas before the family moved to Texas. The first child was George W. Johnston who was born about 1860. George and another unknown child, died before 1880. The other children were John A. Johnston ("Jackson"), Mary I., William, Edward B. ("Burchie"), David, Joseph and Lemuel Thomas (Thomas) Johnston. All of these children except the last two, Joseph and Thomas Johnston, were born in Arkansas. Thomas and Joseph were born in Texas. Out of all the children, Mary never married but continued to live with her mother after the death of her father. Stephen Johnston also served in the Civil War in the 19th Arkansas Infantry, Company F, Dockery's Brigade, saw action at Corinth, and may have been with the unit at Vicksburg. Following the War, Stephen and his young family continued to live in the Lisbon, Ark, area of Union County, where he was engaged in farming, not too far from the farms of his two brothers-in-law, William and Reuben Darden.

Stephen Johnston purchased at least 200 acres of land in Cherokee County when he moved into the area from Arkansas about 1875. The family lived in the Dialville area. After the War, it appears as if Stephen Johnston was never able to determine the fate of his brothers, Eli and James. Eli may have served in an Arkansas unit, either Union or Confederate. Further research may be able to determine exactly where these two brothers enlisted and served during the War and how they fared in it. Because of poor communication and lack of resources in those years just after the War, Stephen Johnston would not have been able to trace his brothers as easily as we can today, with major library and archival records at our disposal. It would be a fine tribute to them if we were to be able to finally locate and honor these two brothers who were never forgotten. Stephen Johnston himself lived until just after the turn of the century, and died leaving his widow, Sarah Johnston to follow him a number of years later. Both

are buried in Rocky Springs Baptist Church Cemetery near Rusk, Texas.

Family tradition has it that the Johnston family came from Scotland to South Carolina and then moved to Arkansas before coming to Texas. We have been able to identify the family in early 19th Century South Carolina and may be able trace them even further back in time to those Scottish roots. It is hoped that the family burial plot in Fairfield County will reveal much information, if its location can be determined and it has not been disturbed over time. It has been shown that the Johnstons, the Dardens, the Durrettts and the other allied families all came from very solid Southern stock who were intermarried with prominent people of the time. It is a very interesting family about which much more may be gleaned in time.

The family lived in an area of South Carolina that saw some ravishing during the Civil War, but not total destruction. General Sherman's troops marched through the Winnsboro area but it was one place on his March that the General made efforts not to pillage. Winnsboro has a newly organized museum and an active history and genealogical association. Hopefully, with these contacts much more can be learned about the family and its Scottish origins.

Several of us are researching our common ancestor, JOHNSON CALHOUN HUNTER. We are interested in determining his parent's names at this time and any information concerning them and then being able to connect to any known ancestors and descendants.

We know he was born on May 22, 1787, in Charleston, South Carolina, and was married to Mary Martha Harbert of Wythe County, Virginia, on November 10, 1809. She was born August 29, 1792, in Lead Mines, Virginia. From books in the Texas Archives we have clues stating that he was of Irish descent, his parents were wealthy, and were related to John C. Calhoun. While none of this is as yet proven fact it is given here as clues to who his parents were.

We also know he received a degree in medicine at the age of eighteen. In hopes of linking to our Hunter past we here include that Ms. Harbert was related to frontiersman Davy Crockett.

For reasons unknown to us at this time Mr. Hunter used the name of JOHN HUNTER while in Circleville, Ohio, and New Madrid, Missouri, and one of us has found it is possible that his given name could have been CALHOUN HUNTER.

While we have much information on Mr. Hunter after leaving South Carolina, we have almost nothing of his time in that State and the above clues are all we have on his parents.



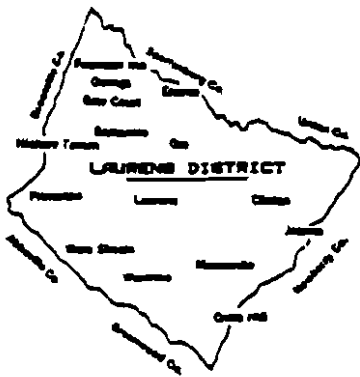
