

This transcription of Floyd Co., Ga. Marriage books N, O, P, Q, R, and S, covering 1921-1939, contains about 10,000 marriages and continues from the earlier volumes, starting with Floyd County, Ga. Marriages – The Early Years. All pre-1940 marriages from marriage books T, U, V, and W are included. The transcription was made from the official court records in the Probate Office of the Floyd Co. Courthouse, Rome, Ga. A new feature to the marriage books is the addition of birth and death dates and parents of bride and groom, when known. Price is \$55 plus \$5.50 postage and handling and \$3.30 sales tax for Georgia residents. To order:
