The challenge to make this study came after learning my great grandfather, John Rabb Ashford, came to Mississippi, from Fairfield County, South Carolina and was buried at Old Concord Cemetery in Choctaw County.

In the process of uncovering facts about the Ashfords coming to Mississippi, other interesting facts revealed themselves. I learned that John Rabb Ashford was the son of James Ashford, James had a brother, George; they married sisters, and both had descendants in Mississippi. This publication deals with some of the ancestors and descendants of James and George Ashford, Jr. of Fairfield County, South Carolina.

CHAPTER I

THE NAME

"Surnames are known to have been assumed, in some instances, before the Norman Conquest; but they did not become general in England until two or three centuries later. Every name, no doubt, originally had a meaning, or was first assumed or imposed from its real or supposed fitness, from some accidental circumstance, or from mere caprice." I

"It was not until a hundred years or more after the Conquest that hereditary surnames were found in any great numbers----Not until the latter part of the thirteenth century are hereditary surnames found to be the rule rather than the exception----For several centuries afterwards, not until the seventeenth century, could it be said that hereditary family names were upon a sound and firm basis and not subject to change at the slightest whim of the individual." 2

The name Ashford, evidently originated because a rural hamlet in England, was established where an ASH tree stood by a ford. In the process of developing names, as we have them now, Ash de la Ford (Norman Fashion), Ash atte Ford (Saxon Fashion), finally evolved to become Ashford.

"Having attained a given name in their own particular manner, like-Walter-who, living in or near Ashford, a rural hamlet, decides to depart, he became known as Walter de Ashford. Eventually the de was dropped." 3

CHAPTER II

MICHAEL ASHFORD, SR.

- 1. Michael Ashford and his wife Ann each filed a will in Prince William County, Virginia in 1734. Michael's will named the following children:
 - 2a. John Ashford
 - 2b. Michael Ashford
 - 2c. William Ashford
 - 2d. George Ashford
 - 2e. Ann Ashford
 - 2f. Mary Ashford
 - 2g. Constance Ashford

It is not known whether they are listed in the order of their birth. Nor is it known by the writer whether Michael Ashford, Sr. was born in America or in England. There was a Michael Ashford living in Charles County, Maryland in 1663. He died and his widow, Johanna, married Thomas Hussey. This Michael could have been the father of the Michael who is the subject of this chapter. In 1698 a certain Michael Ashford went from Charles County, Maryland to Prince George County, Maryland where he "purchased five hundred acres of land for 21,000 pounds of tobacco. This tract of land was a part of a larger tract known as Haddocks Hills alias Seamans Delight."

Michael Ashford probably left Prince George County, Maryland, and moved across the Potomac River into Stafford County, Virginia, late in 1712. Evidently Michael settled in that part of Stafford County, which became part of Prince William County in 1730, and Prince William County was later used to help in the creation of Fairfax County. All the old land deeds and records are found now in the court house at Fairfax, Virginia.

The land which Michael willed to his sons had been a land grant to William O'Daniel November 8, 1720, thence to Michael Ashford by a Proprietors Deed bearing the date of the "Twenty-Ninth day of May anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty-Nine." 2

Part or all of the Michael Ashford estate eventually became a part of the Mount Vernon Estate. George Ashford and his wife, Mary, sold their part of the estate to George Washington. There is also a record to indicate that John and William sold their part of the Michael Ashford estate to George Washington.

As stated above Michael Ashford's wife, Ann, also filed a will in 1734. She named her oldest son, John as executor of her will; Michael named his "loving wife" as Executrix of his will. Evidently Ann died just before Michael, or between the date of Michael's death and the probation of his will. Thus, John became the administrator of his father's will also. The fact he did so, is evidence that he was the oldest living son. This was in accordance with the English Law, which was in force in the Colonies at that time.

Michael Ashford and his family were living in Truro Parish in 1733-1734. This we know since Michael was a Vestryman at that time. The following fact has been discovered: "At the meeting on April 16, 1733, Michael Ashford took oath and subscribed the test as a Vestryman. An agreement was made with the Reverend DeButts to preach three times a month for one year at Occoquan Church." After the year 1733 the name disappears and that of Pohick is substituted. The church stood until superseded by the new or present Pohick in 1744. The attendance record of the Vestry meeting on 11 October 1734, is the last one showing Michael Ashford as among those present. He evidently died not too long after this date, since his will was probated 20th March, 1734.

Michael Ashford's Will

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN the Twentieth Day of October in the year of our Lord God One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty-four, I Michael Ashford of Prince William County Virginia being sick & weak in Body, but of sound and perfect memory thanks be to God for the same and knowing the uncertainty of the life on earth & being Desirous to settle things in order to make, constitute, & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form following That is to say first & Principally I commend my soul to almighty God my creator assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon & remission of my sins, & be saved by the precious blood & merits of my blessed Saviour & Redeemer Christ Jesus, and my Body to the earth from whence it was taken to be buried in such Christian & Decent manner as to my Executrix hereafter named Shall be thought meet & convenient and as touching such worldly Goods & Estate as the Lord in his mercy hath Sent me my will and meaning is the same shall be employed and bestowed as by this my last will & Testament is Expressed And first I do Revoke, Renounce, Frustrate, & make void all wills by me formerly made, and declare & appoint this my last Will and Testament.

I Give & Bequeath to my son John one horse named Roger and one black foal & two cows & two calves.

I Give & Bequeath to my son Michael a horse called his & a young Bay mare and two cows and two calves.

I Give & Bequeath to my Son William a Bay horse called his own & two cows & two calves.

I Give & Bequeath to my son Michael all that Tract of land lying on the Head of Doge Run & Feather Bed with the furniture.

I Give & Bequeath to my sons George and William that Tract of land at Doge Run not before bequeathed to be equally Divided between them allowing their Brother Michael Timber sufficient to supply his necessity.

I Give & Bequeath to my son John a Tract of Land lying between

Doge Run & little Hunting Creek & one feather Bed with ye blanketts &

Rugg and Sheets belonging to it.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ann a little white horse called Cordit.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my son George a Black mare which came of a Dun mare.

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Daughters Mary & Constance two filly foals between them.

I do constitute and appoint & ordain my loving wife to be my sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament and none other in witness whereof hereunto I have set my hand & seal

Signed sealed and delivered

in the Presence of

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Son George one Negro Named Dick.

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son John that Tract of Land upon the head of Accotink.

Item I Give unto my son William a Bed with the Rugg, blanketts & Sheets belonging to it.

Item I Give unto my sons George & William one bed a piece ye with Ruggs, Blanketts & Sheets belonging to them.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Ann, Mary, & Constance each of them one Bed & Furniture with the Ruggs, Blanketts & Sheets belonging to them.

Item I do constitute & appoint my well beloved Wife my sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof the preceding will on the other side mentioned I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twenty-first Day of November 1734.

At a Court continued and held for Prince William County the Twentieth Day of March 1734. This will was presented into Court by John Ashford who made a Oath thereto announcing to Law and the same being proved by the Oath of the Witnesses thereto subscribed was admitted to Record and Ann Ashford Sole Executrix appointed in the said will being dead without having first undertaken the Burden of the Executrix thereof on the motion of the said John Ashford and he performing what is usual in such Cases, Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of Administration with the said will annoted in Due form.

After reading the will, you may be as confused about the dates used as the writer was. The will was dated 20 October, 1734, and it was filed for probate, 20 March, 1734. The dates were given according to the Julian calendar which was used by England and the colonies prior to 1752, when the Gregorian calendar was adopted. According to the Julian calendar in England and in the American Colonies, the first day of the year began with March 25.

CHAPTER III

GEORGE ASHFORD, SR. of NEWBERRY COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA

2. George Ashford, Sr., of Newberry County, South Carolina, is believed to have been the son of Michael Ashford, Sr., of that part of Prince William County, Virginia, which is now in Fairfax County of that State. There was a George Ashford of Prince William County, Virginia, who was a minor in 1734 when his father, Michael Ashford, died. On 17 November 1743 John Guoss, Thomas Leives, and James Beach were appointed the guardians of that young George.

George Ashford, and his wife, Mary, of Fairfax (Prince William) County, Virginia, sold land to George Washington, 135 acres in January 1760 ² and 135 acres on 14 January 1762. ³ The latter reference is the last record found of George living in Fairfax (Prince William) County, Virginia.

The first record found of the George Ashford, subject of this chapter, shows him residing in Union County, South Carolina, in 1784. If he is the same George who is mentioned in the preceding paragraph, the question arises: -- Where did he live from 1762 to 1784? We know the trend of migration at that time was in the direction, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, and South Carolina. It is entirely possible that he was enroute during that time. George Ashford, Sr. patented from the government "163 acres of land in Union County, South Carolina, located on the waters of Cains Creek, Sept. 7, 1784." He evidently lived on this farm until he bought his farm in Newberry County in 1789. Records at the courthouse in Union County show "George Ashford, Sr. and his wife Sally, sells 163 acres of land for \$163.00 to his son Moses Ashford 27 April 1800." The deed specified that the land was located on Cains Creek. Bennett Ashford and Sarah Ashford witnessed the deed.

Prior to 10 July 1789, George Ashford bought 150 acres of land in Newberry County, South Carolina.

Eighteen children were born to George and his wife, Mary, according to his will 'and a Bible now in the possession of A. V. Ashford of Bolton, Mississippi. The names of the children appear herein subsequently.

A bit of circumstantial evidence leading one to believe that George Ashford who died in Newberry County, South Carolina on 31 July 1814, was the son of Michael Ashford of Prince William County, Virginia, may be observed by the part that each used the same given names for their children.

In naming their children, George and Mary of Newberry County, South Carolina, used all the given names which Michael and Ann Ashford of Prince William County, Virginia, had given to their children. It was, of course, a common custom in those days to name the oldest son for his grandfather and the oldest daughter after her grandmother. George named his oldest son Michael and his oldest daughter Ann. Two of the sons of George and Mary Ashford, Michael 8 and George, fought in the American Revolutionary Army in South Carolina.

George Ashford died 31 July 1814 intestate. 10 His wife must have died prior to his death, because she was not listed in his will, nor in the division of his estate. His property (every item) was sold at a public auction on 14 and 15 November 1814. It he proceeds of the sale amounted to \$2,633.42. George and Micajah were named executors of their father's will, but Micajah handled all details of executing it. The reason for this being, Micajah lived with, or near, his father, but his brother, George, lived several miles across the Broad River in Fairfield

CHAPTER IV

JAMES ASHFORD of FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA

- 3. James Ashford, lith child of George Ashford, Sr., born 14 Aug. 1777, died 3 March 1833, m. Mary Rabb, daughter of Robert Rabb and Nancy (Woodward) Rabb of Fairfield County, S. C. She was born 15 Dec. 1780, d. 22 April 1847. James Ashford and his wife were buried in his family cemetery at Strother, S. C. To them were born seven children:
 - 4a. Thomas Woodward Ashford, b. 24 May 1803, resident of Georgia when his mother's estate was settled at Winnsboro, S. C. 1747.
 - 4b. John Rabb Ashford, b. 29 Jan. 1808, d. 7 April 1856. Note: See Section one, this chapter, for further details.

From all indications James Ashford lived all his married life in Fairfield County, S. C. Records indicate that he made his first land purchase, 525 acres from the William Lyles estate, May 20, 1807. This purchase included one acre on south side of Broad River, which was the landing site of Lyles Ferry. He owned and operated the ferry the remainder of his life. The old ferry crossing was near where the concrete bridge spans Broad River now on highway 34 at Strother, S. C. James Ashford made his second land purchase in Fairfield County, S. C., 107 acres, 2 Jan. 1815. His third land purchase was made from Nicholas Ringer, 109 acres, in March 1823. His fourth land purchase was from his brother Simon, 182 acres, Dec. 20, 1825. James Ashford owned and operated a mill in the vicinity of his ferry. The James Ashford family cemetery is located beside the highway a short distance up the hill from where the old ferry landed. The cemetery is enclosed by a stone slab wall about four feet high.

Deed record book AQ, page 639 at the courthouse in Winnsboro, South Carolina shows plats locating the James Ashford mill. Mills Atlas of South Carolina for 1820-25 shows the location of Ashford's ferry. The Atlas shows the location of the James Ashford ferry, and the ferry operated by Moses Ashford, his brother, about fifteen miles up the river.

Evidence indicates that John Rabb Ashford, being the oldest unmarried son at home when his father died, took charge of the property and operated it for the benefit of his mother and the family. Thomas Woodward Ashford and John Rabb Ashford were named as administrators of the James Ashford estate, but the records show that John administered the estate.

THE LAST WILL & TESTAMENT OF JAMES ASHFORD

In the name of God Amen.

I. James Ashford of the District of Fairfield & State of South Carolina, being in perfect health, but considering the certainty of Death, & the uncertainty of the time thereof, & being desirous to settle my worldly affairs & thereby the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God to call me hence, do Therefore publish this my last will and testament; in the manner & form following Viz.

lst It is my Will that my dearly beloved wife Mary Ashford should have dureing her whole life the use and benefit of Two Hundred Acres of Land where my houses are now Situate, to be run off so as to include the Houses and Ferry in the following manner, to begin at the River on my lower boundry line runing out to Emmersons Line, to a Stake corner, then along Emmersons Line to a litewoodnot corner on my old line then along it to a piece of new ground cleard by my Son Thomas Ashford. & his fence to be the Line as far as it continues or to my old line. thence to a Black Jack corner near the Ferry Road, thence to the Rocky bluff on the River where the upper fence of my ferry place now stands, & if that boundry should contain more than Two hundred Acres it is my wish that the over plus should be taken off the End up the road from the ferry, and also the use of my mill & all the profits made by it, and a tract of land of one Hundred Acres-known by the mill tract, and one hundred acres more that lies between the Ferry & mill tracts. on the River, to be laid of so as to mak the mill tract Two Hundred Acres, & all the profits arising from the Ferry, all the money that I may have

at my death and all that is due to me all the Stock, furniture and all other property that I may pofsefs, Except Such as Shall be otherwise disposed of hereafter in this will—I also give and bequeath to my Beloved Wife Mary Ashford to be disposed at her death as she pleases, Eleven Negro Slaves, namely, Isom, Milli peter, Mary, Dick, Stephen, Sisley, Jane - Isaac, Anny & Henry, I also give to my Son Thomas W. Ashford two negroes Dave & Amy. which negroes he now has in his pofsefsion, with their increase forever, and a tract of Land of about two hundred Acres for which I gave Simon Ashford Eight hundred Dollars and also about twenty acres of my old tract which he has now under fence—to him & his heirs forever———

I also Give to my Son John R. Ashford, two negroes Joe. &. Sarah to him and his Heirs forever with their future increase—I also Give to daugher Sarah D. Ashford two negroe girls Lindy. & Vilet. and there increase to hir & the Heirs of her Boddy forever———I also give to my son Robert I. Ashford. two negroes named Dan. & Amy & hir future increas forever————I also give my Son George D. Ashford two negroes named Jacob & Silvy with hir increas forever——

I also give to my son James R. Ashford two negroes namd Minor & Sillar & hir increase forever-----

& when my above named children Severally arrives at the age of twenty one years, or marryes it is my will that there Mother or my Executors herein after named to give to Each of them out of the general stock, one Horse Saddle & Bridle one Cow & Calf one Bed & furniture, and after the death of my wife it is my will that my son George D. Ashford should have the mill & Tract of Land of two hundred acres as mentioned above—and

that my Son James R Ashford Should have the ferry & two hundred acres of land as above directed to be laid of, the Ballance of the land that I am or may be possessed of herein not disposed of. to be sold or xxx Equally divided between my three children. John Sarah & Robert, at the discretion of my Executors & thre Commifsioners to be chosen by them, & the three above named children to have value Equally divided among them, and it is my will that Each of my children should have Equal value in Lands or other property or money to make it so, on the valuation of my Executors & commissioners so to be chosen, & I wish it to be clearly understood, & it is my wish that Each of my children should have Equal shares of all my Estate that may be left at my wifes death, and it is my will that if any of my children should die before they are twenty one years old or marries and not leaving any legal ishue, the ones part so dieing to be Equally divided among my Surviveing children or their Legal heirs. that is if any of my children should die leaving children for them to have the part the Father or mother would have been Entitled to and it is my Will that all the property herein willed to my Children should be kept to gather in the pofsefsion of my wife Mary Ashford for hir & their mutual benefit until they arrive at the age of twenty one years or marries -- out of all which, it is my will that my wife Educates, Cloths, & takes the same care of the children that would bedone if I was with them and further I will that if Either of my youngest Sons James or George to whom I have willed my ferry & mill with the Lands attachd thereto, should die before they come of age or marry as above provided, then it is my will for my next youngest Surviveing son to take their divide of Lands & mak the other children Equal to them in money or other property -- so that their two places be continued in pofsefsion of the

youngest Surviveing sons----and I do constitute my two Sons Thomas W.

Ashford and John R. Ashford to be Executors to this my last will and

JOHN RABB ASHFORD

4. John Rabb Ashford, 2nd son of James Ashford and Mary (Rabb) Ashford, b. 29 Jan. 1808 in Fairfield County, S. C., d. 7 April 1856 in Winston County, Mississippi, buried in Old Concord Cemetery, six miles east of Weir, Miss., in Choctaw County, Miss., m. Elizabeth D. Rabb, daughter of Charles Rabb and Mary V., (Harrison) Rabb 6 Jan 1835. She was born in Fairfield County, S. C., 4 Oct. 1814, d. 4 June 1852 in Fairfield County, S. C. Buried at the James Ashford family cemetery. John Rabb Ashford was a planter in Fairfield County, S. C., and also in Winston County, Mississippi. He owned many slaves and worked much land. He came to Mississippi and bought land in Winston County, but which now is a part of Choctaw County.

John Rabb Ashford and his wife, Elizabeth D. (Rabb) Ashford, had issue:

Movement of the Ashfords from Fairfield County, South Carolina to Winston County, Mississippi in 1852-53: The late Mrs. Caroline Ellen (Turnipseed) Whitmire furnished much of the following information and verified many statements. She was ninety-three years old at the time she was visited, 16 February 1954. She had a most remarkable memory for her age, sat for two hours answering questions and offered many bits of information which would have taken years of research to uncover. She related several items exactly as the writer remembers hearing his grandfather, James Polk Ashford, relate them.

Who was Mrs. Whitmire, and why did she know so much about the Ashfords? Her mother, Martha Caroline Taylor, first married Robert James Ashford. Her aunt, Rachael Y. Taylor, married James Redding Ashford, Robert's brother. Her uncle, Andrew Jackson Taylor, married Catherine Harrison Ashford. Mrs. Whitmire's father, Jesse Turnipseed, was the foreman of slaves for James R. Ashford. Martha Caroline Taylor and Robert J. Ashford had a little daughter Eliza, "Ella", who grew up in the Turnipseed home with Mrs. Whitmire. These facts lead you to conclude that Mrs. Whitmire related the facts from personal knowledge.

John Rabb Ashford, his thirteen year old son, James Polk; James Redding Ashford and his thirteen year old brother-in-law, Andrew Jackson

Taylor, came from Fairfield County, South Carolina, to Winston County, Mississippi, in 1852. John R. bought 1280 acres of land on November 6, 1852, from J. J. Gage, administrator of the estate of J. J. J. Howard. 1 After purchasing the land, James R. Ashford was sent back to South Carolina to bring the Negro slaves.

After the slaves arrived, the first job was to build houses. Land clearing was the next order of business.

In 1853, James R. Ashford, young James Polk Ashford and Andrew Jackson Taylor returned to South Carolina and brought the families over. The two young men mentioned above had the chore of riding ahead of the caravan to select, and prepare the overnight camping site. It is believed that it required about five weeks to make the trip. John R. Ashford did not return to South Carolina.

Known to have been in the caravan coming to Mississippi, in 1853, were: James R. Ashford's family; Catherine and Charlie Ashford, children of John R. Ashford; Robert J. Ashford's widow and her little two year old daughter Eliza "Ella" and Harriet Sophia Taylor, sister of A. J. Taylor.

John R. and James R. Ashford's families lived together in the same house after they came to Mississippi until John R. died and his children married. Robert J. Ashford's widow and her little girl Eliza "Ella", Harriet Sophia Taylor and their brother Andrew J. Taylor, lived together — that is, they lived together until Robert's widow married Jesse Turnipseed in 1856, then Andrew went to live with James R. Ashford.

John R. Ashford was not a well man when he came to Mississippi, this being the reason why he sent his younger brother, James R., back to South Carolina to do the moving. He never regained his health after coming to Mississippi, dying April 7, 1856, and was buried at old Concord Cemetery, in Choctaw County about six miles east of Weir, Mississippi, on the Thompson - Weir - Ackerman road.

In 1853, John R. Ashford purchased 80 acres of land from his brother-in-law, Jonathan Harrison Rabb. During 1853, '54, and '55, he patented 240 acres of land from the government. In 1853, James R. Ashford purchased 880 acres of land from J. H. Rabb. In 1855, Martha Ashford, Robert's widow, purchased 240 acres of land from Stephen M. Steele. When this land was bought it was in Winston County but is now a part of Choctaw County.

In 1856, John R. Ashford had a feeling that he could not live long, so he divided his land among his three children and named his brother James R. administrator of his estate.

John R. Ashford was very considerate of his slaves. He would not permit them to be abused in any way. He brought his slave foreman with him from South Carolina. The foreman agreed to come over to Mississippi provided John R. would bury him next to his grave when he died. The foreman died first, but next to John R.'s grave at old Concord may be found the foreman's grave unmarked except for large sandstone rocks. The slaves belonging to the Ashfords were Baptist.

Inscribed on John R. Ashford's tomb are these words, "Integrity and truth were the remarkable traits that characterized this worthy man." Also, "Mark the perfect men and behold the upright; for the end of man is peace." "Psalms 37th chapter, 37th verse." Mrs. Whitmire said her mother selected the Biblical quotation and authored the other statement on the tomb.

There has been some difference of opinion as to the correct middle name of John R. Ashford. Some say it was "Raiford". An old, old family Bible was found in the home of A. V. Ashford, near Bolton, Mississippi, which listed John R., his brothers and sisters, and three other Ashford families. This Bible listed his name as John Rabb Ashford.

The community where the Ashfords bought their land in Winston County, Mississippi (now Choctaw County) was known as Ashfordville. A store was operated there by James R. Ashford. Records in Washington, D. C., show that Ashfordville Post Office was organized April 25, 1865, and James R. Ashford was the first post-master.

James R. Ashford did not fight in the Civil War. He had so many slaves, and his potential for producing food and fiber was so great that he was ordered to stay home and produce food and cotton for the Confederate Army. He was required to turn over a certain percentage of what he produced to the Confederate Army.

Sherman's Army came by James R. Ashford's house but did not burn anything; they took what they wanted and moved on. (This was probably Grierson's Raiders).

It is reported that the Federal troops took about thirty bales of cotton from his place. It is believed he was paid for this cotton in 1868 and used this money to pay for 160 acres of land in Hinds County, Mississippi, which he purchased for \$1120.00, August 26, 1869.

Robert James Ashford died in Fairfield County, South Carolina, in 1853, before the Ashfords left to come to Mississippi. He names his brother James R. guardian and administrator for that part of his estate which he left his little daughter Eliza "Ella". After the Civil War, when James R. Ashford decided to move to Hinds County, Mississippi, values had declined and he was not able to reimburse the heir of his brother's estate in full value for what it was worth when he took it over

but, having a very strong desire to do so, he insisted on, and did deed Eliza "Ella" Ashford the 1200 acres of land which he owned. "Ella" thought he was doing more than he should have done and stated, "he more than satisfied the debt." | "Ella" is referred to in all legal documents as Eliza. She married Energy Black and made her home on the 1200 acres of land deeded to her by her uncle. The place is known today as "the Energy Black place."

George W. Ashford, a son of George Ashford, Jr., and a double first cousin to John R. and James R. Ashford, came to Mississippi in 1856. He bought 320 acres of land in Winston County, Mississippi, from John W. Turner, on February 8, 1856. ² It appears that he sold or permitted his land to go back to the man he purchased it from in 1858, and he moved to Hinds County, Mississippi, the same year.

Robert Ashford's wife, Martha Caroline (Taylor) Ashford, James Ashford's wife, Rachael Y. (Taylor) Ashford, Andrew Jackson Taylor who married Catherine Harrison Ashford, and Harriet Sophia Taylor who married George Turnipseed were sisters and brother. Martha Caroline Taylor Ashford's second marriage was to Jesse Turnipseed. They had seven children, one of whom was Caroline Ellen - the remarkable ninety-three year old person who verified and gave many of the above facts. She said, "one could not have detected that "Ella" was her half-sister because they were all reared and treated as if they were full sisters and brothers." James R. Ashford sent Eliza "Ella" Ashford to boarding school just as he did his own daughters.

Why did the Ashfords come to Mississippi and stop in Winston County? This question has been asked by many Ashford kinsmen.

Reasons:

- 1. Many people were moving west looking for cheaper and better land.
- 2. Many South Carolina people were settling in Winston County.
- 3. John R. Ashford had a brother-in-law, Jonathan H. Rabb, living in Winston County, who had been there since 1848 buying and selling land. Rabb moved back to South Carolina about 1859 or '60.
- 4. John R. Ashford had lost his wife and three children in South Carolina and he was in poor health.
- 5. Opportunities for getting ahead faster appeared to be greater in the new areas of the west.

5. James Polk Ashford, 3rd child of John Rabb Ashford and Elizabeth D. (Rabb) Ashford, Fairfield County, South Carolina, June 12, 1839, died in Attala County, Mississippi, September 4, 1916, and is buried at Kosciusko, Mississippi. Married Sarah Young Knox, daughter of Captain David Ware Knox and Jane (Hanna) Knox, April 3, 1860. She was born December 6, 1838, in Pickens County, Alabama, and died August 20, 1895, and is buried at Kosciusko. They were married at the home of the bride's parents by Reverend T. A. Alexander. They were Presbyterians.

James Polk Ashford did not fight in the Civil War because he had one bad eye. He lived at the Knox home, four miles east of Kosciusko, and looked after the family and farmed while Captain D. W. Knox was away at war. He bought his farm nine miles southeast of Kosciusko about 1871, where he reared his family and lived until about September, 1902, when he came to make his home with his son James Knox Ashford for the remainder of his life. He was a farmer. He worked in his son's store after he came to live with him.

James Polk Ashford came to Mississippi with his father in 1852, when he was about thirteen years of age. He was known as "Little Jim" to distinguish him from his uncle, James R. Ashford, with whom he made his home after the death of his father in 1856.

James Polk Ashford and his wife Sarah Y. (Knox) Ashford had issue:

He is buried at Tutwiler. He married Callie Ophelia (Hughes), daughter of Madison Gasmore Hughes and Mary Jane (Presley) Hughes. She was born August 17, 1867, near Conway in Leake County, Mississippi. They were married at Conway, Mississippi, February 3, 1885. They were members of the Methodist Church.

James Knox Ashford was a farmer and a merchant. He bought his 320 acre home farm January 6, 1886. The farm was located eleven miles southeast of Kosciusko, Mississippi, in Attala County, and in the Beulah Church Community. ² He operated a general store for many years in the Smyrna

Community, about two miles from his farm. All members of his family were born on this farm. He moved from there to Ethel, Mississippi, in 1910, where he operated a store and farmed for five years. In 1916, he moved his family to the Mississippi Delta, in Bolivar County, near Hushpuckena, where he farmed for two years. In the winter of 1917 he moved to Coahoma County, Mississippi, between Tutwiler and Rome, Mississippi, where he farmed for three years. In 1919, he built his home at Tutwiler, Miss., where his wife, daughter and one son now reside. At Tutwiler he farmed and operated a feed store, blacksmith shop, and grist mill, until his death in 1931. In the spring of 1929 he was stricken with paralysis. His son, Walter Knox Ashford, was drafted by the members of the family to come and take over the management of the property. He is still there, having been deeded the property by all members of the estate in later years.

James Knox Ashford and his wife, Callie O. (Hughes) Ashford, had issue:

Chennault, daughter of William Henry Chennault and Frances T. (Davis) Chennault, January 16, 1910. She was born December 23, 1886, in Attala County.

Dewitt Ashford has been a farmer; operated a thriving transfer business and Pierce Oil Agency in McGehee, Arkansas, and was operating a successful restaurant in McGehee until he was stricken with paralysis in late 1953. They live in McGehee, Arkansas.

Dewitt Ashford and his wife, Willie D. (Chennault) Ashford, had issue:

- 8. James Dewitt Ashford, the only child of Dewitt and his wife, Willie D. (Chennault) Ashford, was born October 8, 1910 in Attala County, Mississippi. He died March 21, 1954, and is buried at McGehee, Arkansas. He married Julia Janson, daughter of Charles Ferdinand Janson and Julia (Jones) Janson, July 22, 1934. She was born January 29, 1913.

James Dewitt Ashford's family had the misfortune of having him taken from them in the very prime of his life. He suffered a stroke of paralysis, a few months after his father had been stricken, and passed on in a few weeks. The writer had intimate knowledge of this wonderful young man for his entire life, and no group of words can be combined to adequately express how fine he knew this young man to be. He was a skilled mechanic. For many years he worked for the railroad. He was most active in Masonic work. He gave much of his time to working with the De Molay's. She is active in her church, served as president of the Woman's Club, and participates in all school P.T.A. activities. She is always in regular attendance at her Home Demonstration Club meetings. As if all the above wasn't enough, she serves as a substitute in the Post Office where she worked full time before her marriage. Yet, she says, "as a family we have never accomplished anything big. We live a quiet peaceful life with our children." Kathleen brightens the spot where she is.

Catherine came to Mississippi in 1853 with the other Ashfords from Fairfield County, South Carolina. She was about nine years old at that

time. She, her father and two brothers lived in the same house with the James R. Ashford family. After her father died, in 1856, she continued to live with her uncle, James R. Ashford, until she married. The writer used to hear his grandfather, James Polk Ashford, speak of the difficult trips he made in taking "Cattie" to boarding school. Every one seemed to think an awful lot of "Cattie". The writer's father used to speak often about his aunt "Cattie". She and her husband lived their lives out on part of the property the Ashfords bought when they settled in Winston County. The area where they settled became a part of Choctaw County, March 2, 1875.

Minnie Lee is one of the many kinsmen met for the first time after undertaking this study of the family history. The writer will long remember the first time he called on Minnie Lee. She was alone at her lovely old colonial home, near Gloster, Mississippi. She reluctantly came to the door. She probably had never heard of her visitor, and even after the introduction was made, she did not appear to be too sure of my explanation of our kinship. After we talked for awhile, she must have decided the writer knew too much about the family connections not to be some kin. Meeting and knowing this Baptist preacher's wife, our kinsman, is one of the most satisfactory experiences the writer has enjoyed. She has in her possession an old, old Bible given to her grandmother, Catherine Harrison (Ashford) Taylor, by Catherine's grandmother, Mary V. (Harrison) Rabb, wife of Charles Rabb, and daughter of Jonathan Harrison and his wife "Sally" Sarah V. (Tyler) Harrison.

James Kirkland Taylor, probably, was more interested in the Ashford and Taylor family history than any of our kinsmen. He resided on his father's old home place throughout his entire life. He preserved many old letters that were passed between our kinsmen in the generations gone by. They have been a wonderful help in making this study. In 1938, he made a trip to South Carolina, accompanied by his son Vaughn and his cousin Robert Joseph Black, and found the old James Ashford family cemetery and had it cleaned off. He served two terms as supervisor in his beat. During this time he worked up a W. P. A. Project and had Old Concord Cemetery, where his grandfather John Rabb Ashford is buried, cleaned off. Many, many people have told this writer what an honest, christian man Kirkland Taylor was.

George and Ruby Taylor wrote the letter which aroused the writer's curiosity, and ignited the spark, to cause him to become interested in making a study of the family history. When you meet George and Ruby Taylor, and their four fine young sons, you will say, here are our "kind of people". When you go into their comfortable rural home, you immediately feel at home. This couple furnished lots of facts which are being recorded in this study. They live in the old A. J. Taylor, Kirkland Taylor home, which was a part of the original land acquired by the Ashfords and Taylors when they settled in Mississippi in 1852. They live about five miles east of Weir, Mississippi, on McCool, Misssissippi, Route 2.

George and Ruby took the writer for the first time to see John Rabb Ashford's grave at Old Concord. We found his headstone broken, and the old cemetery in the woods is badly neglected. We resolved to do something about that headstone and the cemetery. The stone has been reset and the cemetery has been cleaned off twice, and a wire fence put around it. One receives many rewards from studying family history. Meeting and knowing this fine family is one of the BIG rewards.

John James Taylor entered the U. S. Army, September 7, 1943, at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, finished basic training at Ford Leonard Wood, Missouri, and went to Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland to diesel mechanic school for four weeks. He was sent to England, April 5, 1944, and to France D Day plus six with the 238th Combat Engineers. He saw action in six battle campaigns, fought within sixty-seven miles of Berlin, Germany. He left South Hampton, England, December 26, 1945, arrived in New York January 5, 1946, and was discharged from Camp Shelby, Mississippi, January 12, 1946.

She died October 30, 1929, in Yalobusha County and is buried at Palestine Cemetery.

Charlie Joseph Ashford came to Mississippi in 1853, when the Ashford families moved from Fairfield County, South Carolina. He was about six years old when he came to Mississippi. He, his father, brother James

Polk, and sister Catherine lived together in the same house with his uncle James R. Ashford and his family. His mother died in South Carolina, when he was four years old. Charlie continued to make his home with his uncle, "Big Jim", James R. Ashford, after his father died in 1856. Records, at the courthouse, in Louisville, Mississippi, seem to indicate that Charlie received a larger share of the land, his father left, than did his brother and sister. He sold his land in Winston County, Mississippi, and moved away. It is not exactly known where he moved to, but is known he lived in Calhoun County, Mississippi and in Yalobusha County where he died. He was a farmer.

The following is a certified statement of Charlie Joseph Ashford's Confederate Military service obtained from the Director, Department of Archives and History in Jackson, Mississippi.

James S. Ashford went from Water Valley, Mississippi, to Bowie County, Texas, when he was about nineteen years old. He found himself a good wife, and, as the story was told, they literally carved themselves an empire from the wilds in Bowie County, Texas. We have not learned how many thousands of acres of land he really owned. He was a farmer and a rancher, and was considered a progressive person. "Miss Kate", at 84, lives alone in the old family home, a tiny, independent, and inspiring body.

He played an important part in the political history of his county, being a very influential member of the Democratic party. Most of his life was spent in the village of Carbondale, Texas, which is a part of the Ashford estate in Bowie County.

4. Robert James Ashford, the third son of James Ashford and Mary (Rabb) Ashford, was born November 23, 1814, in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He died March 10, 1853, and is buried at the James Ashford family cemetery at Strother, South Carolina. He married Martha Caroline Taylor, daughter of William Kirkland Taylor and Martha Christianna (Pearson) Taylor. She was born July 30, 1830, in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died May 20, 1890, in Choctaw County, Mississippi, buried at Hopewell.

Robert Ashford died the year the Ashfords moved to Mississippi. His wife and little two year old daughter, Eliza "Ella" came along in the caravan. It is not known whether it was his intention to move to Mississippi with the others. It is believed that he did not intend to move, but after he died, his wife decided to come to Mississippi. He divided his estate between his wife and his little daughter. He made his brother, James R. Ashford, the administrator of his estate, and guardian of that part of the estate left to his daughter Eliza "Ella". According to File 100 - 454, at Winnsboro, South Carolina, the final settlement showed the estate was worth \$10,132.42. Mrs. Ashford got \$2951.61; Eliza Y. got \$5903.24, and the remainder went for retainer's fee.

Ashford, did send her to boarding school. James R. Ashford deeded her twelve hundred acres of land in Winston County, Mississippi, when he moved to Hinds County, about

1867. "Ella" made her home there and reared all her family on this farm. The place is still known as the "Energy Black Place". The second house which the Ashfords built, after coming to Mississippi, still stands on the property and is owned by John Ira Turnipseed, a grandson of "Ella" (Ashford) Black.

He made two trips back to South Carolina to see the area from where his mother came. He was most pleased to learn that one of the descendants was attempting to "put something down about our folks." "Bob Jo" went to Louisiana in 1895. He did public work for a few years and then bought a rice farm in 1899. He grew rice until he sold his farm in 1920 and moved to California. SECTION 3

4. JAMES REDDING ASHFORD

4. James Redding Ashford, youngest son of James Ashford and his wife, Mary (Rabb) Ashford, was born November 17, 1820, in Fairfield County, South Carolina, died November 14, 1881, in Hinds County, Mississippi, and is buried in an unmarked grave about ten miles northwest of Bolton, Mississippi, near the old Joe Birdsong place. He married Rachel Young Taylor, daughter of William Kirkland Taylor and Martha Christianna (Pearson) Taylor, June 20, 1849, in Fairfield County, South Carolina. She was born March 14, 1833, in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died December 14, 1880, in Hinds County, Mississippi. Her place of burial is not known.

James Redding Ashford came to Mississippi, in 1852, from Fairfield County, South Carolina, with his brother, John Rabb Ashford, his nephew, James Polk Ashford, and his brother-in-law, Andrew Jackson Taylor. They settled in Winston County, Mississippi. James R. Ashford made a trip back for the slaves in the winter of 1852. In the spring of 1853, he returned to South Carolina to move the families over to Mississippi. An account of who came along in this last move is listed elsewhere in this report.

James R. Ashford purchased eight hundred and eighty acres of land in Winston County, Mississippi, from Jonathan Harrison Rabb and his wife, Nancy (Chappell) Rabb, October 20, 1853. The deed he received to this land is recorded in Deed Book M, Page 636, at the courthouse in Louisville, Mississippi. He later acquired an additional amount to bring his holdings to twelve hundred acres. He lived at this location until about 1867, when he deeded his twelve hundred acres of land to his niece, "Ella" Ashford, to satisfy his obligations to her. He purchased one hundred and sixty acres of land, August 26, 1867, about eleven miles northwest of Bolton, Mississippi, for \$1120.00 and moved there about 1867. The deed to this land is recorded in volume 30, page 734, in the courthouse at Raymond, Mississippi. The land is described as the $SE\frac{1}{4}$, Section 13, Township 7. Range 4. The land was purchased from Jefferson J. Birdsong.

James R. Ashford was the guardian of his niece, Eliza "Ella" Ashford. Her father, Robert James Ashford, died when she was about two years old. Her assets consisted of cash and slaves. James R. Ashford worked the slaves and invested her money. When he decided to move to Hinds County, "Ella" was about old enough to come into possession of her estate. The Civil War was over and the slaves had been freed—their value had been wiped out, but he was desirous of paying to her on the basis of including the value of the former slaves. Times were hard and money was scarce; he thought it fair to deed "Ella" the entire twelve hundred acres of land to satisfy his debt to her. She thought this was unfair to him, but he insisted and deeded her the land. Ella is known to have said, "this more than satisfies the debt." James R. Ashford sent "Ella" to boarding school and paid for her education from her money that he held in trust.

James R. Ashford's niece, Caroline Ellen (Turnipseed) Whitmire, said, "he did not fight in the Civil War. He was ordered to stay home and produce food and fiber for use by the Confederate Army. He was required to turn over a percentage of his production to the Confederate Army." It was reasoned that his potential for producing food and fiber was so great that he would do more good for the cause of the C. S. A. by staying on the farm. It is to be remembered that he had his own slaves, those belonging to "Ella" and those belonging to his brother John Rabb Ashford's estate. The law exempted men from military service who owned twenty-nine or more slaves. It was reported that Sherman's army came by his place but did not burn anything, although they did take about thirty bales of cotton. This was probably Grierson's Raiders.

James R. Ashford was known as uncle "Big Jim" to the Ashfords around Ashfordville. This was to distinguish him from his nephew, James Polk Ashford, who lived with him. James Polk Ashford was known as "Little Jim".

The writer attempted to find where James R. Ashford and his wife were buried. Everyone contacted would direct me to go see Milton Farr. He was contacted at his home about nine miles northwest of Bolton, Mississippi, and this is what he said, "I was a young man riding along with Will Henry on horseback, in front of Joe Birdsong's place, and he pointed off in a westerly direction and said 'right down there about a half mile, on Joe Birdsong's place, is where Mr. Jim Ashford, the father of Dr. Albert Ashford's wife, is buried.'" This location should be about two miles and a half from where James R. Ashford was living when he died. When an attempt was made to locate the graves, Mr. W. H. White was living on the old Joe Birdsong place. Mr. White lives on the right side of the road as you go in a northwesterly direction from Bolton, Mississippi. In front of Mr. White's house is a narrow gravel road that leads off at an angle in a westerly direction; down this road four-tenths of a mile from Mr. White's house, and to the left of the road, in a pasture, was the location of the old cemetery. was some evidence that there used to be an old cemetery there, but there were no markers.

CHAPTER V

3. GEORGE ASHFORD, JR.

3. George Ashford, Jr., sixth child of George Ashford of Newberry County, South Carolina, was born February 11, 1758, died April 25, 1815. He is buried in his family cemetery in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He married Jemima Rabb, daughter of Robert Rabb and Nancy (Woodward) Rabb of Fairfield County. Nancy (Woodward) Rabb was a daughter of Thomas Woodward, "The Regulator", and Jemima Collins. Jemima Rabb was born about 1771, in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died in 1839, buried in the George Ashford, Jr. family cemetery.

There were eight children born to George Ashford, Jr. and his wife Jemima (Rabb) Ashford. Namely:

The dates of birth and death of the three girls could not be obtained. Records at Courthouse in Winnsboro, South Carolina, show:

Elizabeth married Mr. Smith, Mary married William Smith, and Hariot married Samuel Brown. All evidence obtained indicates that all the above named children were born on their father's plantation in Fairfield County, South Carolina.

The George Ashford, Jr. family cemetery is located in Fairfield County, South Carolina. The writer visited this cemetery in June, 1954. In going to this cemetery from Columbia, South Carolina, travel Highway 215 about fourteen miles to the intersection with Highway 269. Follow 269 about six and one-half miles, turn left on gravel road and go about one-half mile. This should bring you to where Mrs. W. R. Ashford lived when the writer was there. Inquire there about the exact location of the cemetery. You will find that you are within a quarter of a mile of the cemetery. Mr. J. P. Brooks, Winnsboro, South Carolina, Route 3, lives within fifty yards of the cemetery. The cemetery is enclosed with a substantial fence.

Louisa Laughlin (Ashford) Robinson (Mrs. C. A.), a great grand-

daughter of George Ashford, Jr., who lives in Winnsboro, kept the cemetery cleaned off as long as she was able to get out there. The writer had the pleasure of meeting "aunt Loulie", as she is known, when he was in Winnsboro, in June of 1954.

George Ashford, Jr. could be the one who persuaded the Ashfords to move to South Carolina. He is known to have been a Revolutionary soldier in South Carolina as early as 1781. He acquired his first land, 103 acres, on Bogans Creek, in old 96th District, July 6, 1789, by patent. His next land acquisition was by patent on Little River, August 3, 1795. He puschased much land in 1805, in Fairfield County, South Carolina, including one tract of fourteen hundred and forty—three acres from his father—in—law, Robert Rabb. It is not known just how much land he owned at his death, but, as you will see in the following Will, he parcelled out twenty—five hundred acres to his children. Some of George Ashford Jr.'s land has been in possession of his descendants to this date.

The following reference to George Ashford's Revolutionary War service is provided for the information of his descendants who may be interested in joining D. A. R. or S. A. R.:

The exact date of his move to Hinds County is not know, but it is believed

to have been during the winter of 1858 or the spring of 1859. He purchased land about eleven miles northwest of Bolton, Mississippi, where he lived until his death February 21, 1880. According to his grandson, A. V. Ashford, he "owned about four hundred and eighty acres of land when he died". The exact location of his place of burial, or that of his wife, is not known at this time.

Dr. James Albert Ashford was about four years old when he came from Fairfield County, South Carolina, to Winston County, Mississippi, with his parents in 1856. They were double second cousins, their respective grandfathers having married sisters. Dr. Albert Ashford studied medicine under old Dr. West Farr and practiced for many years in Hinds County. He lived on his four hundred and eighty acre farm which he inherited from his father and which he added to until he had seven hundred and twenty acres when he died. His grandson, H. T. Ashford, Jr., described him as "a man small in stature, wore a beard, wiry and full of action." He lived so that "his word was his bond." As one of the old time beloved "country doctors", he endeared himself to many, many people. The people appreciated the sacrifices he made to minister to their needs.

When you drive up to Dr. Ashford's lovely old home you get the impression that here is where a fine family was reared. Then, when you know the people who grew up there, you know that your first impression was correct. When Mary Caroline Ashford's parents died she brought her younger sister and brother into her home and kept them as if they were her own children. "Molly" had precedent set for her in this respect, for her mother had done the same thing for John R. Ashford's three children. Ausburn Vaughn Ashford, Dr. Albert's youngest surviving son, lives on the old home place. It was here that the writer found the old, old family Bible, which evidently belonged to James R. Ashford, that had listed in it the names of George Ashford, Sr.'s family, James Ashford's family, John R. Ashford's family and James R. Ashford's family. Three generations were listed in this one Bible. This geneological record is most valuable to all the descendants listed in this publication. A copy of the record in this Bible may be found in Volume 3, Cemetery and Bible Records to be published by the Mississippi Geneological Society.

Dr. Hartwell Taylor Ashford, Sr. attended school at Farr School

House, Edwards, Mississippi, and finished Jefferson Military Academy, Washington, Mississippi. He obtained his M. D. degree from Louisville Medical College. He did post graduate work at Sewanee. He practiced medicine in Hinds County, Mississippi, for over fifty years. He celebrated his fiftieth anniversary of the day he started practicing medicine and his fiftieth wedding anniversary at the same time in 1953. The Board of Trustees of Mississippi College appointed him physician for the school in 1928. He accepted the job reluctantly but stayed with it, ialong with his other practice, until 1950. The writer learned unofficially that Dr. H. T. Ashford, Sr. and Dr. George E. Atkins performed the first mastoid operation in Mississippi, in 1920, at the told Jackson Infirmary. Dr. Ashford was one of the old family doctors who never spared himself when his services were needed. He had the confidence of his patients and the respect of his colleagues, and was beloved by men and women from all walks of life, both white and colored. He was a Baptist, Mason, Kiwanian, and member of Mississippi Medical Society. Much of his time as a physician was spent during the days when the house calls were made on horseback, in a buggy or on a bicycle. For recreation, he was an ardent fisherman, and hunted as leisure time allowed. For more details about the life and accomplishments of Dr. H. T. He is a very busy man, but it takes a busy person to get things done. "Bubba" was graduated from Jefferson Military Academy, attended Mississippi State College, and Mississippi College at Clinton. In 1928, he went to work for the Federal Government as Civil Engineer for the Mississippi Levee Board at Lake Providence, Louisiana. He became deputy Circuit Clerk in Hinds County, Mississippi, under Mr. E. D. Fondraun, April 2, 1929, where he served until he was elected Circuit Clerk, in 1939. He has been Circuit Glerk of Hinds County since 1940. He was elected without opposition in 1947 and in 1955. "Bubba" was chairman of the Advisory Board of Selective Service for Hinds County. He is a member of Lions Club, Odd Fellows,

a Mason, a Shriner and a member of the Baptist Church at Clinton, Mississippi.

He served on the committee to plan for the first big Ashford Reunion at Ackerman, Mississippi, in 1955. "Bubba's" inspiration has been of very great help in assembling facts about the Ashfords.

Thomas Stonestreet stated in his will which was probated 2 April 1771 to "my daughter Elizabeth Ashford 4 & besides what I have given her already." I John Ashford died in 1765 without making a will and his land descended to Butler Stonestreet Ashford. Butler Stonestreet Ashford, and his wife, Susannah sold the land to John Bates. (Land was on Accotink Creek, Fairfax Co., Va.)
