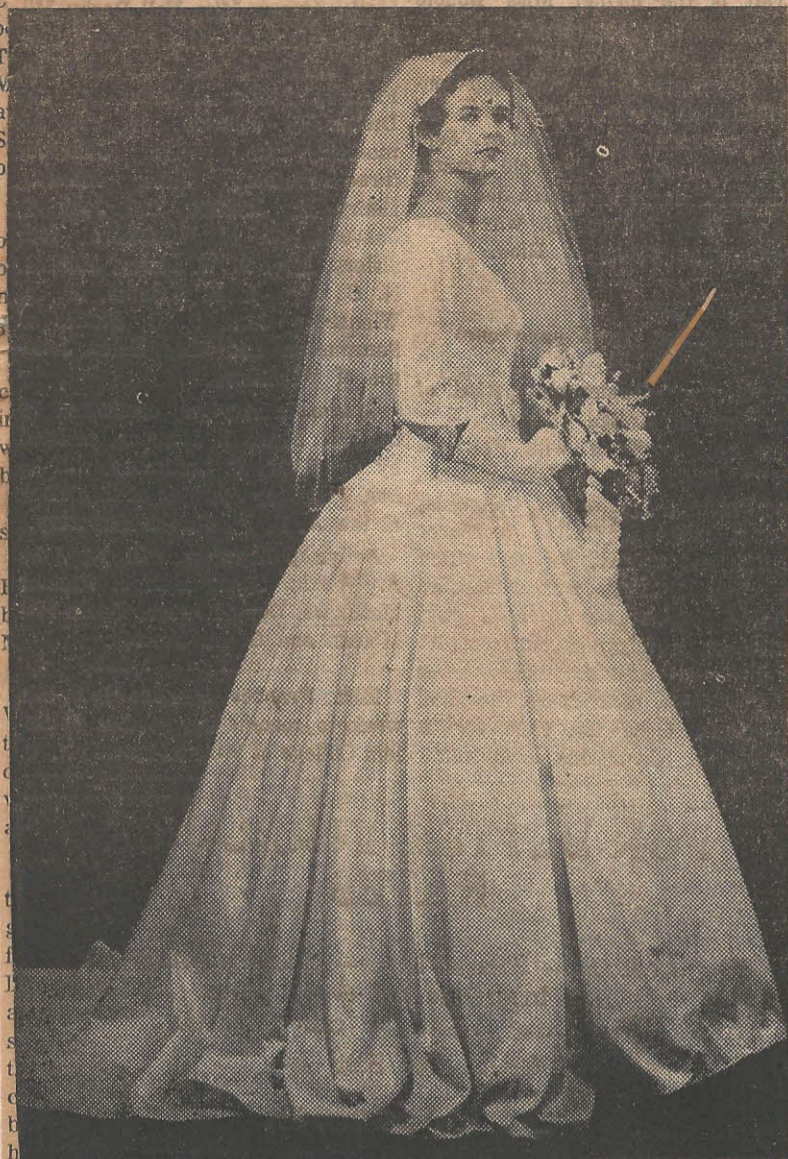


Miss Floride Dwight Buchanan Is Bride of Mr. John T. Heyward, Jr.
