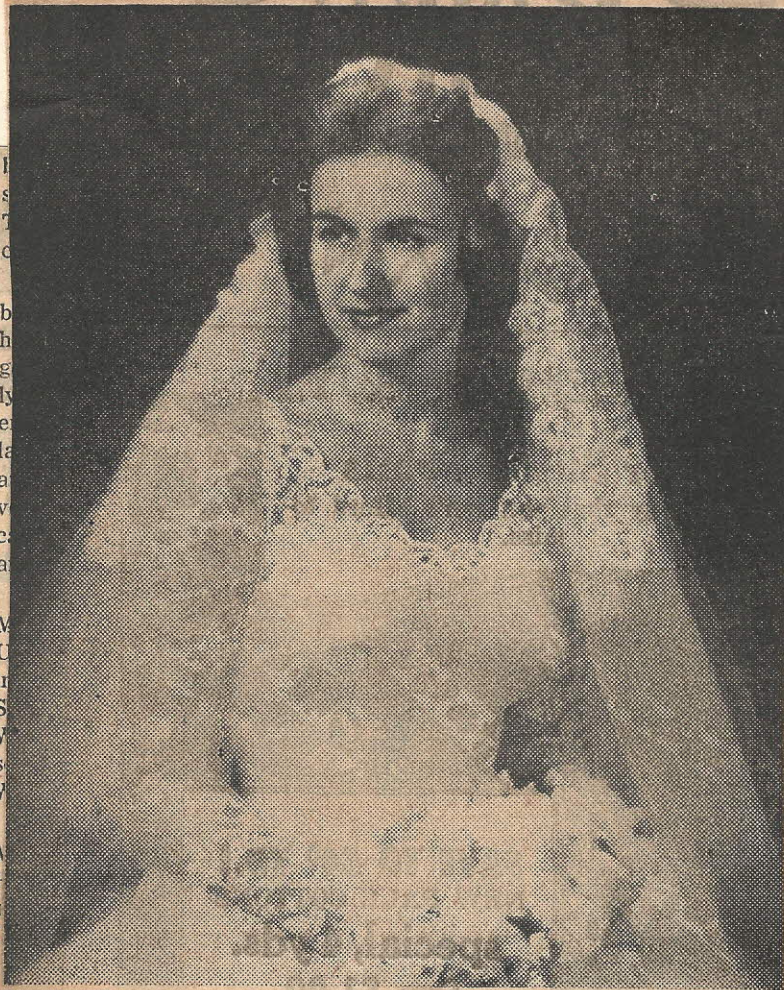


## Miss Margaret Bruton Mays Is The Bride of Mark Hanahan Doty, Jr.
