Following the ceremony a reception was held at the Mustin Beach Officers' Club.

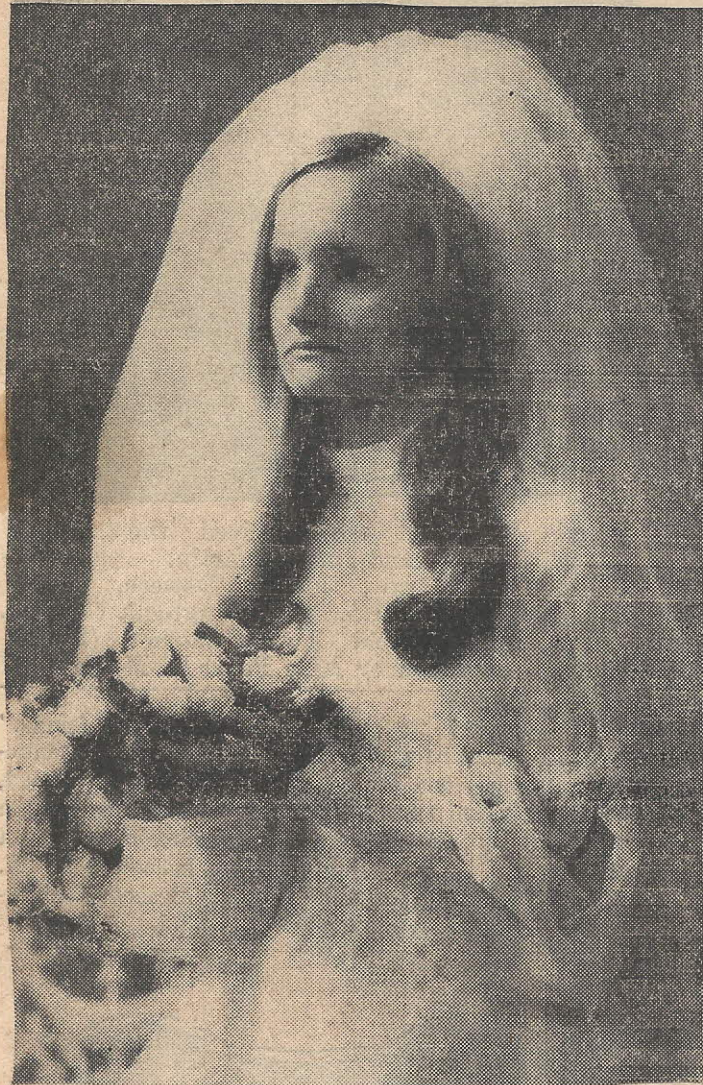
