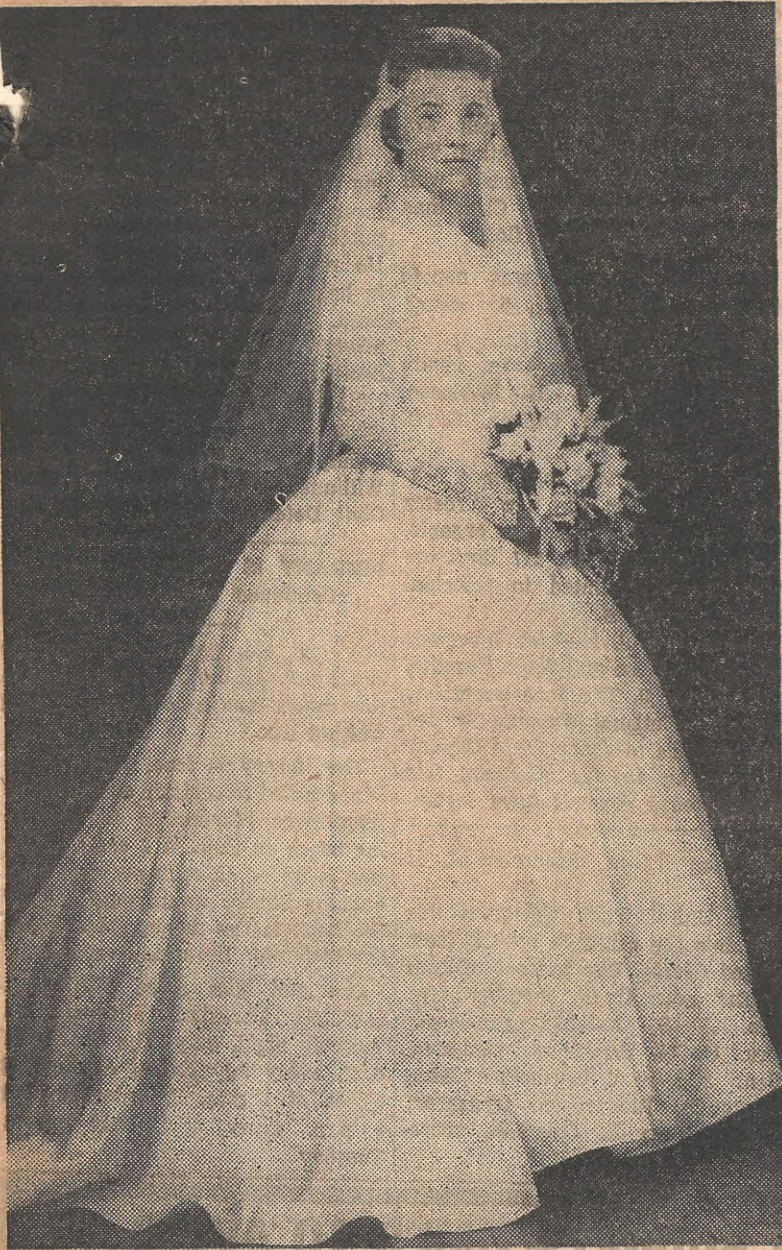


Miss Katherine L. Martin Is Wed To Mr. Nance in Church Ceremony

Autumn leaves and lighted candles in candelabra decorated the church.

The wedding music was presented by Mrs. John Robinson, soloist, and Miss Nancy Blair, organist.

The First Presbyterian Church in Columbia, S. The Reverend James Wylie Jackson, D.D., pastor of the church assisted.

Palms, white lighted candles in cathedral candelabra decorated the church.

Fred Howard Parker, organist, and James Grubbs Martin, soloist, presented the wedding music. Mr. Martin sang "The Song of Ruth" by Gounod, and "The Wedding Benediction" by Lovelace.

In the reception room Magnolias and lighted candles were used. The bride's table in the dining room was covered with a lace trimmed embroidered cloth. A beautiful three-tiered cake centered the table. Lighted white tapers in silver candelabra were used at either end of the table. On the buffet a pair of crystal vases held pink rosebuds and white tube roses.

During the evening the bride and bridegroom left for their wedding trip, and after July 1st, they will make their home in Durham, N. C. For traveling the bride wore a blue and white sheath silk tweed with a matching bolero. White accessories and a white orchid from her bridal bouquet completed the outfit.

Mrs. Martin finished Columbia High School and was recently graduated from Queens College in Charlotte where she was active in the college activities, serving on the Boarding Student Council, and president of Pan-Hellenic Council. She is a member of Chi-Omega Social Sorority.
