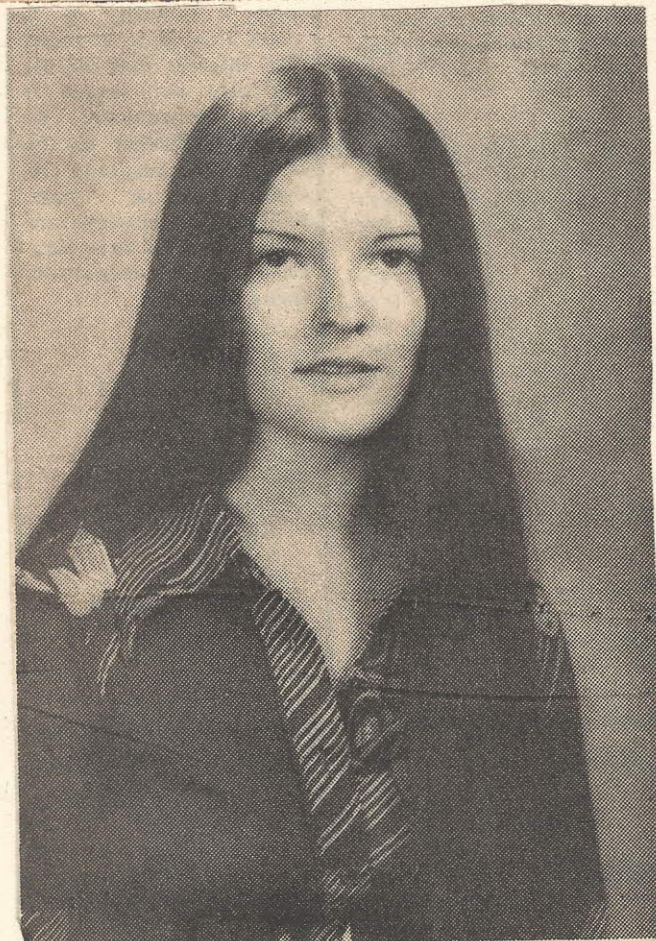


Jeffcoat-Mincey Engagement Told
