Newspapers

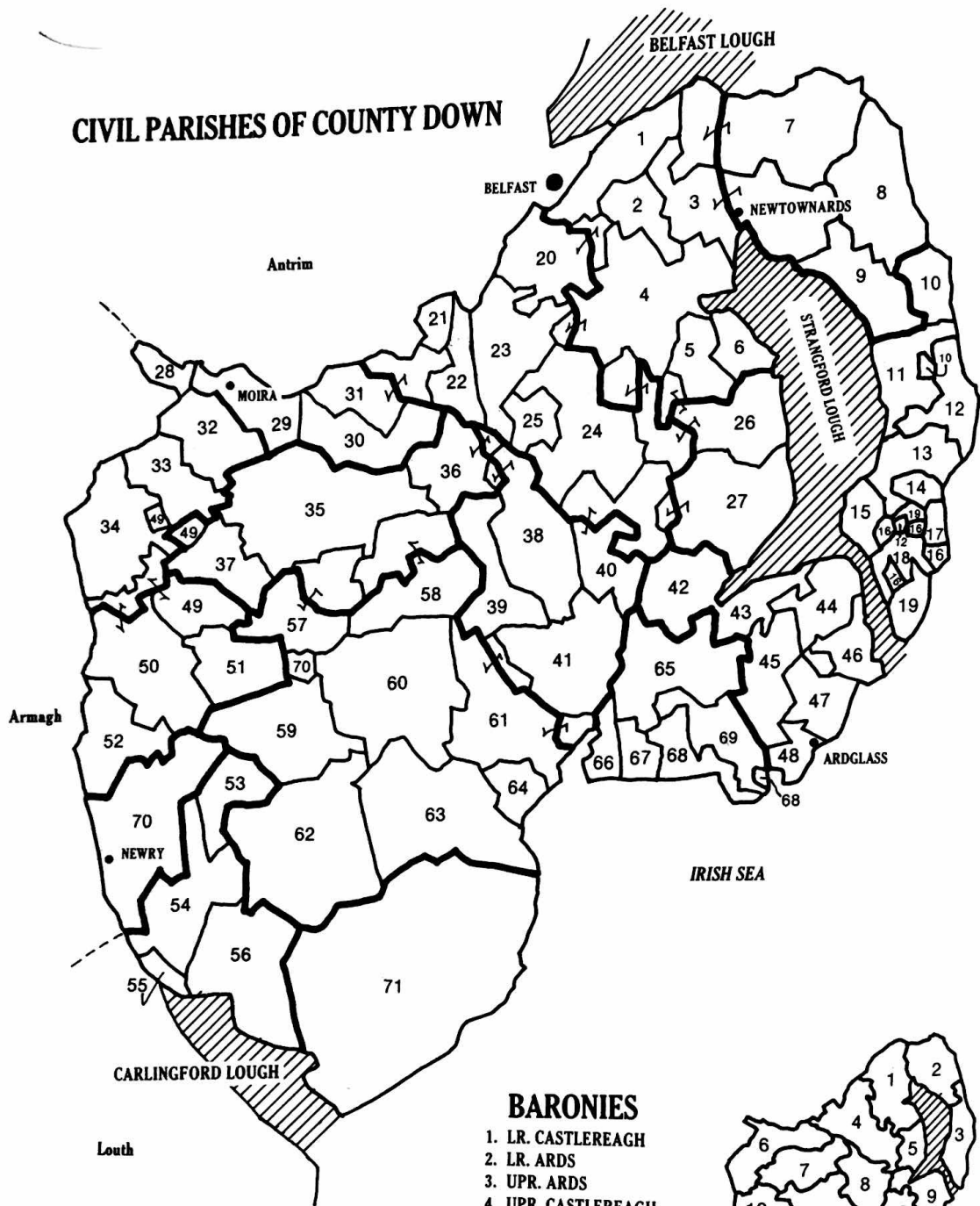

Down Civil Parishes as Numbered on Map

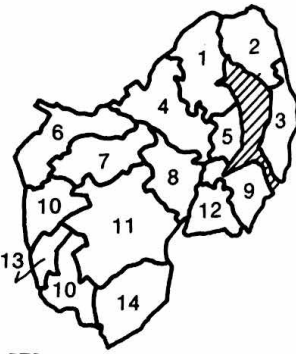
